What is this program, and why do we have it?

The Education Program promotes the American Legion Auxiliary's role in providing quality education for children and adults through classroom activities, literacy programs, scholarship promotion and support of education beyond high school, especially for military children.

What Can You Do?

1. Enhance respect for the sacrifices of our military heroes among schoolchildren by scheduling Veterans in the Classroom programs at local schools.

Ideas:

Member

- Volunteer to provide transportation to and from the school for the veteran speaking in the classroom.
- Contact your local schoolteachers to see if they would be interested in hosting a Veterans in the Classroom event.

Unit

- Reference the publication *Veterans in the Classroom: History in the First Person* on the Legion's website at www.legion.org/publications for helpful hints on starting this program in your area.
- Collaborate with your local American Legion post to present Veterans in the Classroom within your local schools.
- Provide information to the teacher hosting your program about the challenges facing today's military families.
 - o The teacher can introduce the topic before your unit's presentation. One example is this article that was published in the Legion's magazine: http://www.legion.org/magazine/162500/hardest-year
- Promote your Veterans in the Classroom event through local media and on your own social media accounts.
- Wear your American Legion Auxiliary apparel when you visit schools.

Department

- Encourage units to collaborate with their American Legion post to present Veterans in the Classroom programs in their communities.
- Encourage discussion to explore how the needs of today's military families are different/similar to those of previous wars.
- 2. Promote American Legion Auxiliary scholarships, and award local scholarships at the department and unit levels.

Ideas:

Member

- Inform school-aged children in your community about national, department and unit American Legion Auxiliary scholarship opportunities.
- Make copies of any scholarship applications (found at www.ALAforVeterans.org/Scholarships), and provide them to schools.
- Volunteer to be on the scholarship selection committee.
- Make a donation to American Legion Auxiliary education scholarship funds:
 - o Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship
 - o ALA Foundation at www.ALAFoundation.org
 - o Department, district or unit scholarships

Unit

- Assign a member to communicate with school guidance counselors/teachers regarding scholarship applications.
- Create a Unit Scholarship Fund to award scholarships to local students.
 - o See "How to Create a Unit Scholarship Fund" following this Plan of Action for suggestions.
- Prepare a news release with scholarship information for local media and your post/unit newsletter.
- Form a committee to select scholarship winners.
- Publicize the winners of Auxiliary scholarships at a school presentation and through the media.

Department

- Promote scholarship information. National scholarship applications are available at www.ALAforVeterans.org/Scholarships.
 - o Post these applications to your department website along with your department scholarships.

3. Build a relationship with your local schools — focus attention on "Give 10 to Education," American Education Week and Teacher Appreciation Week.

Ideas:

Member

- Volunteer to be the Education chairman.
- Participate in the Give 10 to Education program by soliciting items from members to distribute to the schools in your district.
 - Place a poster with a collection box at local sites (i.e., grocery stores, banks, senior centers, post office), and invite local residents to donate.
- Promote Auxiliary scholarships during American Education Week using local media and your own social media accounts.
- Promote Teacher Appreciation Week (May 2-6, 2016) by sending cards to your local school's teachers.
 - o Donate resources that teachers or needy children my need.
 - Send a card to all local school staff during American Education Week (November 16-20, 2015) thanking them for the work they do.
 - o Include all school personnel who children interact with (i.e., bus drivers, custodians, etc.).

Unit

- Endorse the Give 10 to Education program.
 - o Contribute supplies to classrooms in your community.
- Participate in American Education Week (November 16-20, 2015). Remember to recognize all school personnel, not just teachers.
- Promote Auxiliary scholarships during American Education Week using local media and your unit's social media accounts.
- Promote Teacher Appreciation Week (May 2-6, 2016) by reaching out to teachers, and ask how your unit can enhance their school curriculum.
 - Find out if there are any needy children, and figure out what resources your unit can provide to the student.
- Educate school administrators on how the American Legion Auxiliary can have a positive impact on students.

Department

- Endorse the Give 10 to Education program, an Auxiliary program that promotes the collection of school supplies for local schools in increments of 10.
- Encourage participation in American Education Week (November 16-20, 2015).
 - o Promote Auxiliary scholarships during American Education Week.
- Promote Teacher Appreciation Week (May 2-6, 2016).
 - o Encourage units to plan teacher recognition events at local schools.

4. Assist and support veterans pursuing higher education and vocational education.

Ideas:

Member

- Be the member who volunteers to collaborate with a Student Veterans of America chapter or other campus student veterans group at colleges and universities in your community.
- Sign up to receive The American Legion's Legislative Action Alerts, and support the alerts regarding the GI Bill.

Unit

- Collaborate with a Student Veterans of America chapter or other campus student veterans group at colleges and universities in your community.
- Arrange for your post home to be available for off-campus events/chapter meetings.
- Provide information/handouts to members on organizing and delivering presentations on career and life skills topics to student veterans.
- Promote events through local media and your own social media accounts.
- Encourage members to sign up to receive The American Legion's Legislative Action Alerts, and support the alerts regarding the GI Bill.

Department

- Give suggestions on how a unit can collaborate with a Student Veterans of America chapter or other campus student veterans group at colleges and universities in your department.
- Provide information/handouts to units on organizing and delivering presentations on career and life skills topics to student veterans.

- Promote the American Legion Auxiliary Non-Traditional Student Scholarship, available for students who are returning to the classroom after some period of time.
- Share and support The American Legion's Legislative Action Alerts, particularly the alerts regarding the GI Bill.

5. Assist and support military children with educational opportunities.

Ideas:

Member

- Identify military children in your local classrooms.
- Reach out to a child who has a family member deployed.
- Offer individual tutoring/assistance to a military child who is struggling.

Unit

- Inform schools of a free tutoring website for military children: www.tutor.com/military
- Collaborate with The American Legion, Sons of The American Legion and/or other small organizations to hold a fundraiser for the benefit of a scholarship for a descendant of a veteran.
- Organize a classroom recognition event for military children to share the accomplishments of their relative who is serving.

Continuing Education Grant Department President's Scholarship

NATIONAL

1. <u>Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship</u> - The National Presidents' scholarship is awarded to children of veterans who served in the armed forces during the eligibility dates for The American Legion. One \$3,500 scholarship, one \$3,000 scholarship and one \$2,500 scholarship will be awarded in each

division. Fifteen outstanding students will be awarded a total of \$45,000 to further their higher education. The applicant must complete 50 hours of community service during his/her high school years to be eligible for one of these scholarships. See the application rules sheet in this plan for information.

- 2. The Non-Traditional Student Scholarship One scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded in each American Legion Auxiliary division. Applicant must be a member of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion and shall have paid dues for the two preceding years and for the calendar year in which the application is made. See the application rules sheet in this plan for information.
- 3. <u>Spirit of Youth Scholarship</u> One Junior member in each division will receive a scholarship valued at \$5,000. The applicant must have held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the immediate past three years, hold a current membership card and continue her membership in the American Legion Auxiliary during the four-year scholarship period. **See the application rules sheet in this plan for information.**
