- April 1—Junior Convention, Spring DEC meeting, Spring Finance Meeting at Post 83 in Sandusky, Oh
- April 2—Poppy Shop at Ohio Veterans Home

Please make sure you are checking your Plan of Actions for deadline dates, reservation deadlines for upcoming events, and ideas that can still be implemented this year.

There is still time to have a fundraiser for the Military Family Assistance Fund. Our donations are not keeping pace with the needs of those being referred to us for help. Please consider private donations, Unit, District, local businesses, other veteran service organizations, Lions Clubs, Exchange Clubs, etc. No donation is too small.

It is time to assess what we need to do to become a goal Unit, a goal District and a goal Department. Membership is *everyone's* responsibility. As of January 31, any member not paid is now considered delinquent by National. MEMBERSHIP Shirley Maurer, Chairman

Mid-Winter Conference is over and we are starting on the downward hill of our Auxiliary year. If you did not attend Mid-Winter, you missed a really good time. There was a lot of valuable information given out along with the infamous membership skit and the presentation of the Friendship Quarters to our Department President. We had nineteen (19) units that turned in membership for a total of 641 renewals. Good job ladies.

Membership incentives were given out at Mid-Conference and the winners were as follows:

- ➤ Incentive #1 \$200 to the first district to have all their unit officers members paid this went to Paula Christman District 12
- ➤ Incentive #2 \$50 to two (2) units that have all their unit officers' membership dues paid by December 31, 2016 District 3 Buckeye Unit 174, North Star and District 5, Unit 659 Berlin Heights. Two surprise incentives were given out for this with District 2, Minster Unit 387 and also another unit which I did not get written down. Both of these units received 2 dozen Buckeyes for them having their officers paid.
- ➤ Incentive #5 This was another surprise incentive \$50 to another goal unit **District 6, Johnstown**Unit 254
- ➤ Incentive #8 \$50 to the unit bringing in the most Membership at Mid-Winter **District 7, Ross**County Unit 062, Chillicothe. They brought in 96 senior renewals and 1 junior renewal for a total of 97 renewals.

Congratulations to all the winners.

I can't stress enough our membership. We are over 1500 renewals down from last year at this time. We have to realize that our membership is our life blood if we want to continue with our programs. Without our membership, our programs are going to suffer and I really don't want to see that happen. We do such good things for our veterans and they desire our support. Just think what it would be like if our veterans did not protect our country. Things would be completely different today.

As of February 8, 2017, we have 17 units that are goal. Let's see how many more we can have by the end of the year. At Department Convention, a drawing will be held for all goal units. Three units will be drawn with the first drawn receiving \$100; second one drawn receiving \$50 and the third one drawn receiving \$25.

Department and National have given us many tools to help us increase our membership. Katie has sent these tools to you for your use. If you have not received information on this, contact Katie at Department and I am sure she will be happy to send them out to you again. If there is anything that us as Department Officers or Past Department Presidents can do to help you, please do not hesitate to give us a call. This is what we are here for – to help you – this is YOUR organization.

IMPORTANT – NEW ONLINE DUES PAYMENTS PROCESS – Beginning February 1, 2017, all online dues payments we receive from National via your members will be processed, a receipt will be issued where the Unit will be credited the amount of the Unit's portion. Because of the positive response and the increase of members paying their dues online, the Department finds itself issuing a much larger amount of checks. Some checks are in the amount of \$3.00 or less. This has increased the cost of processing at the Department. Therefore, the Unit will now see a credit on their receipt with the name and the amount that was credited to their account. Very similar to how it has been conducted previously, the only difference is that the Unit will not receive a check; instead they will receive a credit. Credits can be used at any time for membership payment. If the Unit wishes to have a credit check issued we will do so during the month of June 2017. We must have received your credit request by June 30th. There will be a Unit Check Request Form for you to fill out to receive a check. Any questions can be directed to Heather Wilson at Department.

So for this coming month, let's try to pull ourselves out of the negative and into the positive by getting your unpaid members to pay. The second dues notice from National went out on January 15th.

DEPARTMENT JUNIOR CONVENTION RULES AND ORDER OF BUSINESS April 1, 2017

The Convention meetings shall be called to order at the designated time.

The Chair may deviate from the printed program when necessary.

The audience shall remain seated during the business of the Convention, unless participating in the program. No one shall be permitted to enter or leave the Convention hall during the presentation of awards, when a speaker has the floor, or during voting.

A member wishing to address the Convention shall rise, address the Chair and, when recognized, shall give her name, Unit, and District number before stating her business.

Only registered Delegates, or authorized Alternates acting as Delegates, seated in the assigned location, are eligible to vote.

An alternate replacing a delegate unable to attend the convention shall have her senior advisor notify the third member of the Department Junior Activities Committee, who is in charge of the registration committee.

All Junior and Senior members shall observe appropriate conduct and dress during Department Junior Convention.

The District Junior Activities Chairman or the Senior District President shall be the adult advisor for the District Delegation.

The Credentials Committee shall report at such times as directed by the Chair.

Each District Junior President shall poll her delegation and announce the voting strength upon District Roll Call prior to voting. This number cannot be more than that reported by the Credentials Committee.

No one will be permitted to enter or leave the Convention Hall during voting time. Delegates must remain in their District, not leaving the section in which their District is located, except for dire emergency. Delegates will lose their vote if not in the proper voting section when voting by ballot occurs.

Nominations for Honorary Junior Officers shall be made from the floor by her District's Honorary Junior President.

The current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall be the parliamentary authority on all points not covered by these rules.

TALK THE TALK...WALK THE WALK

Over the next few months these Bulk Mails will contain information provided to every Leadership Chairman in our National American Legion Auxiliary. The details can be found in the National Leadership Program of Action in the section called "How To Sheets" at www.alaforveterans.org. The Ohio Program of Action for Leadership can be found at www.alaohio.org. At both websites, you will find many tools to help seasoned and new members understand "WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO". Please take the time to research and read this information. If you are not computer savvy...go to your local library, ask a friend or relative to help you download information.

HOW TO COMPLETE A REPORT & WRITE A NARRATIVE STORY

Mid-Year and End Year Reports

- Review & read the OHIO Programs Action Plan (formerly Plan of Action) for your program to determine objectives to accomplish during the year. They were mailed to the Unit President to distribute to the Unit Chairman or you can find them online at www.alaohio.org or you can request an email copy from the Department Chairman. To locate this information go to the Programs Action Plan What Can You Do? Ideas for the member and the unit.
- It is IMPORTANT to read <u>thoroughly and completely</u> as each program has different criteria. Some require dollar values; number of volunteers; number of veterans served (be specific "many" is not numerical); impact reports some require totally different information. One size does not fit all.
- Compile data, total numbers, activities from your members and treasurer and then determine where the information fits the Ohio Programs Action Plan objectives.
- If an activity crosses several Programs, decide to use the numbers on one or distribute them across the Programs that are involved.
- Write the narrative, and forward it by deadline to the individual who is to receive the report. This is listed in the Programs Action Plan.
- If we as department chairmen do not receive information from our units, we cannot report "What Ohio Does" for the programs.

WRITING YOUR UNIT NARRATIVE STORY

- The word narrative often panics people. Don't let it! You are really writing a story about what your unit did or if it's a member specific award, what they did for the program.
- Think of a member you have not seen for a long time. Here's your chance to tell that member what has been happening in the unit for the year.
- Review and read the OHIO Programs Action Plan awards...there will be two types you can submit – National and Department. Each has different criteria.
 Some require impact reports in order to be considered. READ CAREFULLY!
- Where to start:
 - Plan ahead check the Programs Action Plan and decide what the unit would like to accomplish and what goals the unit needs to accomplish to achieve any awards. Remember most units cannot do all the programs. Pick and choose what your unit does best.
 - Try and keep a journal of what your unit and members have done through the year.
 - o Go to the Programs Action Plan What Can You Do? Ideas for the member and the unit.
 - O When you find the "What Can You Do" section, you will see there are subtitles on what to accomplish...go to the ideas for members and unit under that subtitle. Then decide if the unit has accomplished any of those activities.
 - Once you have gone through all the subtitles and determine the activities the unit has accomplished start writing...who, what, when, where and how.
 - o Be very specific in your writing. Try to write in the 3rd person...not my or I, but the unit, chairman or member. If the award is member specific, you will have to mention the name.
 - Keep in mind that the Department Chairman, are looking for the criteria specific to their program. If in doubt what to write, contract the Department Chairman and ask for advice.
 - Trust me...you will not get it right on the first writing...it may take 3 or more times...start early...write then walk away...come back reread and rewrite...suggest you put a Revision on each copy just in case you removed something and now you want it back.

You can make a difference by having contact at the local offices of your congressman and senators there isn't a photo op for this but you will be surprised how you can make a difference and have influence by being in contact with the local offices of your Congressman.

It is Important to remember several things when contacting your elected officials. ALWAYS be polite and respectful! It is essential you let them know we are intelligent caring people, and if you say you are talking to them as an American Legion Auxiliary member discuss only items that pertain to veterans and active duty military and our agenda PLEASE!

A Good working relationship with your elected officials really can make a difference for our veterans and active duty military!

One state Senator told me several years ago that for every intelligent person who contacts him, he feels there are 25 constituents who feel the same way who have not contacted him. So yes take the time to contact your elected officials. It does make a difference!

Hope you have encouraged your unit to order ALA Legislative Advocacy Guide or download it.

Subscribe to e newsletters from your State and National elected officials, especially those that are on Veterans committees. When they sponsor or vote for the Veterans issues we support.... Thank them it takes just a few minutes to email them, call or write a note.

Remember if you meet them you are putting a face on veteran's and military legislative topics, *our* agenda.

Work with your Legion and SAL counterparts when possible. It will make more of an impact when elected official see you all want the same thing. 

POLICY REGARDING CANDIDATES FOR DEPARTMENT OFFICE

CANDIDATES FOR DEPARTMENT OFFICE-Paragraph 13 of 2016-2017 Department Policy

- a. Any Unit member in good standing is eligible to hold a Department Office.
- b. All candidates seeking a Department Office must submit a Letter of Intent to Department Headquarters by April 1st of the year of elections.
- c. Each District may endorse no more than one candidate for a Department Office. A letter of endorsement may be submitted to the Department Headquarters by April 1st of the year of elections to be published in the May, June, July issue of the Buckeye Messenger.
- d. A candidate seeking a District's endorsement for a Department Office may only be endorsed by a majority vote of delegates attending a District Summer Convention.
- e. A Candidate may use either a letter or flyer (not both) to announce her candidacy to the Units. The reproduction of this announcement shall be at the candidate's expense. The candidate shall send her announcement to Department Headquarters no later than April 30th for inclusion in the May Bulk Mailing to Unit Presidents.
- f. The candidate may have one poster, not to exceed 22" x 28", announcing her candidacy. This poster may have a picture of any size and may be placed at the entrance of the Convention Hall or Registration. It should be removed after the Session is closed. Requests and payment for display easels must be into Department Headquarters at least two (2) weeks prior to Department Convention.
- g. All Department Officer candidates <u>may</u> visit each District caucus as a group or as deemed appropriate with the schedule.
- h. There will be no campaign material or campaigning allowed in the convention center or hall. Pages will be instructed to ask individuals to remove the material as they enter or will be asked to leave the Convention Hall.
- i. Campaign materials are permissible during a Joint Reception, if one is held, or placed in convention bags and must be coordinated with the Department Secretary/Executive Director for hotel logistics and Registration Committee if needed.
- j. All Department Officer candidates may have a Joint Reception to be coordinated by Department Headquarters held at a time that does not conflict with any Auxiliary convention activities including the Joint Session. Light refreshments may be provided by the candidates.
- k. Candidates for any office shall be nominated by a Delegate of their choosing other than any member of the Department Executive Committee (Department President, Department First Vice President, Department Second Vice President, Department Secretary/Executive Director, National Executive Committeewoman, or District President.)
- 1. The Presiding Officer will ask for further nominations prior to presenting all candidates to the delegation before the election.
- m. Each candidate may address the Department Convention for two (2) minutes when introduced.
