- What are some important dates in your Unit history and what happened to make them important?
- Has your Unit worked with other community organizations and what did you do?
- Do you have families with multiple generations?
- What great things has your Unit done for your community and the youth?

Your Unit may have kept annual histories and may also have scrapbooks with pictures. These could be very valuable in your research and planning. You may even have an event where you may want to have some of these on display.

Use the above information when planning your Unit's celebration activities.

Unit History

Buckeye Unit 174 in District 3 was chartered on 20 May 1935 with 21 members. Their charter officers were: President Estelle Gavit, 1st Vice President Mary Spraley, 2nd Vice President Jan Nisonger, Secretary Eleanora Brandewie, and Treasurer Margaret Romer.

The Unit's current membership goal is 92 Seniors and 5 Juniors. The longest continuous member is Elizabeth (George, Keiser) Schlarman with 75 years. The ladies recruit and retain members by word of mouth and announcements in the church bulletins. Their favorite service project is making blankets for veterans. And I can attest that all these ladies are amazing cooks. When they do a carry in dinner I guarantee that no one goes away hungry! Great job, ladies!



Forest Unit 67 in District 10 was chartered 21 November 1921. Daphne Weiss was the first Unit President. They had 19 charter members. Current membership goal is 50. The Unit's longest continuous membership record is held by Pearl White with 73 years.

The ladies recruit and retain members by word of mouth and transfers. Their favorite service activity is the Honor Trip. Bessie Kauffman, their last living charter member, died at 102. They have sent Girl State Delegates since 1945. Their delegate, Linda Crocker, was governor in 1964.



It's interesting so see how they used to promote things in the earlier years. Isn't this clever? It would be great to see more creative ideas in promoting programs and events...and don't forget to share them with the Public Relations chairman.

If you want that narrative sent on for National judging, it must include the **National Report and Award Cover Sheet**. We do not want a unit to be disqualified for an award because the criteria were not met. Members have worked hard all year to assist those in need in their communities and we want to recognize those good works. The Community Service Department Report Form is one of the items required for the Citation of Merit and must be sent to your **District Community Service Chairman**.

While the reporting year is ending, the needs of those in your community are ongoing. Remember to remain visible representatives of The American Legion Auxiliary. As you volunteer, wear the Auxiliary emblem and/or you unit name with pride. Continue to record your unit's activities and the member's hours so they can be reported for the 2018-2019 year.

Education Deb Meyer, Chairman March 2018

Hopefully spring is just around the corner. Time to feel the warm sunshine, hear the birds singing again, flowers blooming, and state testing in our schools. Schools will be participating in statewide testing the first weeks of April. What can you do to help get our students through testing? Maybe your unit could provide snacks for the children or volunteer in the schools. Check with your local school and see what their needs are.

March 15 has arrive and so has many, many scholarship forms. I had a unit president tell me she had a wonderful candidate for a scholarship. I just want you all to know, there are many, many wonderful candidates for the only four scholarships. The winners of all scholarships will be announced from the podium at the Summer Department Convention in June. This might be a good time to discuss sponsoring your own scholarship from your unit. It does not matter how much the scholarship is but that it is rewarding a student for his or her hard work. Fifty or a hundred dollars could buy a book. It does not have to be much.

Many school PTA/PTO hold fundraising activities or festivals in the spring of the year to help buy supplies and needed equipment for the next school year. Check with your local school organizations and see what they are doing and if there is anything your unit could do to help. Remember if you are out working in the community to wear your auxiliary apparel to help with public relations.

It is time to start thinking about reporting. All reporting is important even though it is not in a criteria for the Citation of Merit. What programs have your unit and members participated. Did anyone donate school supplies to their local schools for Give Ten for Education? There is a printable citation to be awarded to a member for every ten items she donated. That certificate is available on the national website. Did you work with your Post and participate in the Veterans in Community Schools? Did your unit help with educational needs of military children and their families in your community? Calculate your hours and moneys spent to help provide any educational activities. Scholarships are a large part of the education program. Did your unit contribute to the scholarships fund for the Department and/or local school scholarships? Does your unit have its own scholarship? How many hours did your unit's scholarship committee spend selecting the students to move on the Department level? Check with your unit members to make sure you have all of their hours volunteering in the school, in school organizations, with school fundraising, and any other educational activities.

Please check the Education Plan of Action for all awards. We all should know by now in order to receive a National or Department award, you will need to have a narrative. Your report must also have the National Report and Awards Cover Sheet found at the back of the Plan of Action. A narrative can be as simple as writing your activities as a story. You can include pictures to better describe and show what you did this year. There is a plaque for the National unit award, Most Outstanding Unit Education Program, which is given in each Division. The Department awards the Agnes Merritt Plaque to the Unit Education Chairman with the Most Outstanding Overall Education Program. The Betty Robaszkiewicz Plaque goes to the unit contributing the largest monetary donation to the Department of Ohio Education Fund. All reports are due to me by April 15, 2018. It is important for your unit to at least submit the Department report form so we can have your numbers. Remember the report form needs at least one number in the bottom six boxes. If you sent a scholarship form, you spent time selecting the applicant and spent money mailing the application so take a few minutes and report it.

National Teacher Appreciation Week is May 6-12, 2018. It is time to make plans to show appreciation for the teachers in our schools and their dedication to our children. How can your unit show teachers they are appreciated for the work they do? Your unit could do something as simple as serving cookies and treats or giving each teacher an apple. If you have funds, maybe serve a lunch or a carry-in for the teachers. Even a small token of a thank you note and a couple chocolate kisses show thoughtfulness and who does not like chocolate?

If your Unit has not work to develop the Education Program Veterans in the Community Schools, it is not too early to get started for next year. This program would be a good one to work on now and then have in place for Veterans Day next fall. The guidelines are on the National website.

I hope some of you have had a chance to check out the Medal of Honor Foundation website and the programs for teachers. If not for this year, another thing to work on for next year.

When we all work together, we only enhance our children's futures.
