

Key Program Statements

- Be knowledgeable on flag history, etiquette, and proper disposal methods, and promote the observation of patriotic holidays so your community will look to the ALA for information.
- Increase participation in the Americanism Essay Contest.
- Participate in the promotion of The American Legion Americanism programs.
- 1. **Objective Goal:** Promote the American Legion Auxiliary through community education about flag etiquette and respect in support of our country and military.
 - **a. Action Step:** Be the go-to organization in your community for flag promotion and protection. Be active in observing patriotic holidays. Encourage flying the flag every day. Be knowledgeable on flag history, etiquette and proper disposal.
 - **b. Action Step:** Participate in the Pocket Flag project by providing flags to deployed troops. Publish flag etiquette tips in the local newspaper and on social media. Model respect for the flag at public events.
- **2. Objective Goal:** Increase awareness and participation in youth activities that support proper respect for our flag and loyalty to our country.
 - **a. Action Step:** Encourage participation in the Americanism Essay Contest by increasing awareness through stronger networking in schools and those home-schooled. Create information packets explaining the contest, deadline dates and award opportunities.
 - **b. Action Step:** Teach flag awareness in your local schools, giving flags to the schools. Teach youth about folding the flag. Have a veteran explain the folds. Involve students in flag retirement ceremonies, learning the proper way to dispose of the flag.
- **3. Objective Goal:** To promote all aspects of Americanism and patriotism with the American Legion Family.
 - **a. Action Step:** Work with the Legionnaires to host an open house and explain who we are, what we do and why we do it. Wear your official American Legion Auxiliary blouse or shirt with your pins, smile and be professional.
 - **b. Action Step:** Strive to have an Americanism chairman in every unit, explaining the importance of this chairmanship. Present Americanism facts at a unit meeting

HOW TO PROMOTE "STAR SPANGLED KIDS"

Star Spangled Kids: Educate youth on the history of the United States from the aspect of patriotism, Americanism, and the U.S. Constitution.

- In conjunction with local schools, create a Unit Citizenship Award for children and youth who have demonstrated the ideals of the U.S. Constitution.
- Team with the Education chairman to bring veterans or servicemembers into the classroom to talk about what their service means to defending the ideals of the Constitution.
- Share "Fascinating Facts about the U.S. Constitution" each month in the department or unit bulletin, in tweets, or in a newspaper editorial.
- List important constitutional dates by chronological order or by month.
- Encourage students to test their knowledge of the Constitution.
- Distribute patriotic coloring book pages for children in primary grades.
- Celebrate Constitution Day (also known as Citizenship Day) on September 17, the day set aside each year to commemorate the signing of the U.S. Constitution. Celebrate at September's Junior meeting with a cake or cupcakes. Let Juniors report on different sections of the Bill of Rights
- Print and distribute pocket copies of the U.S. Constitution for school children and/or Juniors.
- Put on a skit or musical about the Constitution and the signers.
- Hold a scavenger hunt in the post where children find information relating to the Constitution.
- Have members dress up as signers of the Constitution and describe the role of their character in the writing and signing of the Constitution.
- Encourage high school-aged students to use their knowledge of the U.S. Constitution by participating in The American Legion Oratorical Contest.
