
Auxiliary Members,



IMPORTANT!!! IF YOU ARE <u>NOT</u> THE PERSON WHO WILL BE HANDLING THE 2020 MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR YOUR UNIT, PLEASE PASS THIS LETTER ON TO THE PROPER PERSON.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you and your Unit of the NEW Online Dues Payments process, beginning November 2020. All Online Dues Payments we receive from National via your members will be processed, a receipt will be issued where the Unit will be credited the amount of the Unit's portion. Because of the positive response and the increase of members paying their dues online, the Department finds itself issuing a much larger amount of checks. Some checks are in the amount of \$3.00 or less. This has increased the cost of processing at the Department. Therefore, the Unit will now see a credit on their receipt with the name and the amount that was credited their account. Very similar to how it has been conducted previously, the only difference is that the Unit will not receive a check, instead they will receive a credit.




I hope that you and your family have been safe and healthy during our Nation's difficult crisis.





Legislative

I was honored to attend the Washington Conference as the Legislative chair from the Department of Ohio. I attended the Legislative session and found it most informative. The National staff, while all new to their positions, were very organized and well versed on the Legislative agenda.

The meeting was opened with a speaker from the 'Stars and Stripes' publication. The Department of Defense plans to eliminate funding for the paper in their 2021 budget. The paper provides independent coverage of news to service members and their families. While they do receive some funds from advertising, the papers published in areas such as Iraq and Afghanistan get no local advertising money. He asked for support in opposing HB 7920 and requested we consider subscribing to the publication online. Unbiased reporting on the issues that affect our military is much needed.

A discussion on 'Toxic Exposure and Burn Pits' highlighted the need to support S.2950 – Veterans Burn Pits Exposure Recognition Act of 2019. This bill lays the groundwork for and requires future studies. The American Legion feels it has the best chance of passage of the several bills before congress. Military members would not have to document exposure just proof that they were in the area. Some of the presumptive conditions linked to toxic exposure are hypertension, Parkinson-like diseases, and bladder cancer.

The 'Deborah Sampson Act' has passed the House but a different version is in the Senate. They are the same in name only. As more women serve in the military, the VA needs to better meet their specific needs. While some improvements have been made, many female veterans still need to go outside of a VA facility for care.

The American Legion's support of the VA's Suicide Prevention efforts is ongoing. The suicide rate among veterans, especially female veterans, is well above that of their civilian counterparts. Post -Traumatic Stress Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injury are factors in the higher rates. We were urged to ask our representatives to support of S. 785 the Commander John Scott Hannon Veterans Mental Health Care Improvement Act of 2019.

Veterans homelessness continues to be an issue. The problem is even more difficult to address for female veterans with children. Providing higher funding for the HUD-VASH (Housing and Urban Development and VA Supportive Housing) Homeless Program vouchers would offer some help to those in need.

Other issues in the Legislative Point Papers were also discussed.

The National staff gave an excellent presentation on the plan to upgrade the VoterVoice. The Action Alerts can be targeted by state and congressional district. Geocoding would show how many activists and Legion Posts are in a specific region. A 'scorecard' would be available that would show how legislators voted on issues of interest to us.

The staffs upcoming plans would include restructuring the Legislative Committee and Council. It could include adding all new members to the VoterVoice data base, unless they opt-out, when they join. The Veterans Allies Action Coalition (for non-members) would also be added to the data base. The more individuals that receive the action alerts the better. Their studies have shown that 24% of those who get alerts take action!

Together we are and will continue to make a difference for all veterans.
