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## Key Program Statements

- In all 50 states the American Legion Auxiliary proudly host ALA Girls State, an amazing week of learning focused on responsible citizenship and love for God and country.
- ALA Girls State delegates are a diverse group of young women with a shared desire to learn and lead. ALA Girls State “citizens” come together from small towns, big cities, and rural areas to hold ALA Girls State elections, and their varied backgrounds set the stage for a week of spirited, experiential learning.
- The American Legion Auxiliary Girls Nation is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for young women. This weeklong event gives participants a firsthand experience with practical insight into how the federal government works.
- ALA Girls Nation connects participants with their peers from across the country, allowing the young women a unique opportunity to spend time with others who share common interests and those who have different perspectives from their own. The girls leave Washington, D.C. with a deeper understanding of government, a renewed sense of patriotism, and an appreciation for veterans.

1. **Objective Goal:** Increase awareness of the American Legion’s Auxiliary Girls State Program.
  - a. **Action Step:** Our core purpose is to enlighten and educate young women on responsible citizenship, leadership, and love for God and Country. This is accomplished by immersing the girls in learning the political process of electing officials for all levels of City, County and State government.
  - b. **Action Step:** Set up a Buckeye Girls State information session that both prospective delegates and parents can attend to acquire additional information about the program.
  - c. **Action Step:** Use social media accounts to get the word out about the opportunity to apply for the 2022 Session of Buckeye Girls State. This would be a perfect time to create a Facebook page, Twitter account, Instagram and/or other appropriate social media accounts, for your Unit and promote the sites.
2. **Objective Goal:** Select a diverse group of young women to participate in Buckeye Girls State.
  - a. **Action Step:** Work with the high school educators, community organizations and church leaders to help identify possible candidates. Key factors in successful recruiting is: 1-completed their Junior year of high school and have at least one semester left before graduation; 2-have a desire to learn and are interested in government and current events; 3-have high moral character and posses strong leadership skills and 4-be above average in scholastic achievements.
  - b. **Action Step:** Candidates must be interviewed and selected by the Unit. The school counselor, principal, or co-contributor **cannot** choose the delegate.
3. **Objective Goal:** Promote the scholarships/awards that are available to those delegates who attend Buckeye Girls State.
  - a. **Action Step:** Samsung Scholarship – participants of each ALA Girls State program, who is a direct descendant of a veteran, is eligible to apply. One citizen from each state is named as the Department finalist. Ten National winners will receive a \$10,000 scholarship and ten National Runner-Ups will receive a \$5000 scholarship. The remaining department finalists will receive a \$1,250 scholarship.
  - b. **Action Step:** BGS Endowment Fund Scholarship – Two (2) \$1,000 BGS Endowment Scholarships will be awarded to two (2) outstanding BGS Citizens.
  - c. **Action Step:** Girls Nation Award – Two (2) Delegates and (2) Alternates will be selected by the BGS Selection Committee to attend Girls Nation in Washington, DC. Delegates attending will play the role of Senator and introduce and bill to be presented to the Girls Nation Senate.

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- d. **Action Step:** University of Mount Union Scholarship – University of Mount Union offers the following:
  - One (1) credit hour to all participants who complete the BGS program and attend the University of Mount Union.
  - \$2,000 a year scholarship renewal up to four (4) years to Buckeye Girls State graduates who enrolls full-time at the University of Mount Union.
  - One (1) internship scholarship at Washington Center in Washington, DC for one year for a BGS alumna who attends the University of Mount Union.
  
4. **Objective Goal:** Promote the BGS program to co-contributors for funding for BGS delegates.
  - a. **Action Step:** Ask other veteran, civic or booster organizations to sponsor your BGS delegates.
  - b. **Action Step:** Network with schools to help find funding to send delegates.
  - c. **Action Step:** Ask parents of past BGS delegates to contribute to the Unit Girls State program. They know firsthand how the program works.
  - d. **Action Step:** Have members donate to the BGS Endowment Fund for current and future scholarships.
  
5. **Objective Goal:** Recruit sufficient volunteers to staff all areas of Buckeye Girls State.
  - a. **Action Step:** Volunteer staff come from many different fields, such as education, government, former Girls State participants, ALA members, and anyone interested in furthering the program. Others that participate in the program are counselors, state and local government officials, public officials and speakers who provide guidance in their respective fields of expertise.
