

The Flag & Sporting Events 2024 - 2025

Americanism Committee Flag Etiquette Article 2 November 14, 2024

#### Why the Flag is Displayed

We have all been to a sporting event that began with the national anthem and recognition of the United States Flag. Whether it be at a local high school, community park, or professional stadium, sporting games often start with anything from a solo of the national anthem to a full-fledge performance with massive American Flags.

According to the History Channel, the tradition of playing the Star-Spangled Banner during sports events began during the 1918 World Series game between the Boston Red Sox and Chicago Cubs. The baseball game took place a day after a bomb had gone off in Chicago, only adding to the national heartache caused by the continuing Great War. The World Series continued to play the anthem at each of its games that year and the practice was soon adapted by other sports leagues around the nation.

Although the tradition started as part of the war effort, sports fans continue to sing the anthem and recognize the American Flag before competition. The American Flag represents enduring principles of this country and the sacrifices that men and women have undertook to make these principles a reality. The moment taken before a game to recognize the Flag and sing the anthem helps fans to remember the history and values that can unite people of various states, races, ethnicities, and backgrounds.

#### How the Flag is Displayed

In a sports arena, there may be several Flags: championship flags, Flags from other countries, or conference flags. It is important that the American Flag is flown in the highest, most prominent position among the other Flags.

The American Flag is often highlighted—with lights, fanfare, or other method—when the national anthem is sung before a sports competition. Regardless of the style of performance, the American Flag should be treated with respect and care throughout it. The American Flag is not a prop for an entertaining act but an important representation of this country's history, values, and people.

#### How You Should Respond

The national anthem is a time where we come together to honor our country in a unified manner. During sporting events, it is expected that you be attentive when the anthem is playing. Stand, place your right hand over your heart, and sing along or listen in respectful silence. If you are wearing a hat, remove the hat with your right hand and place it over your heart.

Star Spangled Kids: Educate youth on the history of the United States from the aspect of patriotism, Americanism, and the U.S. Constitution.

- In conjunction with local schools, create a Unit Citizenship Award for children and youth who
  have demonstrated the ideals of the U.S. Constitution.
- Team with the Education chairman to bring veterans or servicemembers into the classroom to talk about what their service means to defending the ideals of the Constitution.
- Share "Fascinating Facts about the U.S. Constitution" each month in the department or unit bulletin, in tweets, or in a newspaper editorial.
- List important constitutional dates by chronological order or by month.
- · Encourage students to test their knowledge of the Constitution.
- Distribute patriotic coloring book pages for children in primary grades.
- Celebrate Constitution Day (also known as Citizenship Day) on September 17, the day set aside each year to commemorate the signing of the U.S. Constitution.
  - Celebrate at September's Junior meeting with a cake or cupcakes.
  - Let Juniors report on different sections of the Bill of Rights
- Print and distribute pocket copies of the U.S. Constitution for school children and/or Juniors.
- Put on a skit or musical about the Constitution and the signers.
- Hold a scavenger hunt in the post where children find information relating to the Constitution.
- Have members dress up as signers of the Constitution and describe the role of their character in the writing and signing of the Constitution.
- Encourage high school-aged students to use their knowledge of the U.S. Constitution by participating in The American Legion Oratorical Contest.







#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

The American Legion Auxiliary Department of Ohio recognizes the importance of education and the role it plays in personal, professional, and economic fulfillment. The Women Veterans Scholarship Program provides grants to women who serve, past and present, to help them attain their educational goals. The Women Veterans Scholarship Program offers financial support in Undergraduate Degrees, and Graduate Degrees. Scholarships are awarded only for coursework from accredited institutions. Scholarships are based on merit, academic potential, community service, letters of recommendation, and need.

#### ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be a woman who has served or is serving honorably in the U.S. Armed Forces; Active, Reserve, or National who served honorably and is a resident of Ohio.
- Undergraduate Program: Applicant must be currently enrolled at an accredited college or university and have completed 30 credit hours of course work with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better.
- Graduate Program: Applicant must have achieved an undergraduate degree with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and must be enrolled in or accepted into a Graduate level program — Masters or Doctoral.

#### AWARDS

Selection of the Scholarship recipient(s) are made by the Education Committee appointed by the Board of Directors of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Ohio. The Committee will determine the two (2) scholarship winners to be awarded \$500.00 for each scholarship. The scholarship funds may be used to assist with tuition, fees, books, and school documented room and board. Scholarships are awarded only to students attending accredited institutions. The funds will be sent directly to the recipient. If selected, Scholarship recipients are to provide a) a photograph and a statement for use in American Legion Auxiliary Department of Ohio publications, newsletter, website, social media, and marketing materials, etc. and b) follow-up information and feedback as to how the scholarship assisted in their education for research and marketing.

#### CRITERIA

All application materials, including application form, essay, official transcript(s), two recommendations, proof of enrollment at designated accredited academic institution, as well as commander's verification of active duty or qualified documentation of service (e.g., Dept. of Defense Form DD-214, Discharge Documents, Active Service Documents, etc.) must be submitted and postmarked by May 1, 2025.

#### List of Required materials:

- Application This form is required. You may apply for only one scholarship.
- Verification of active duty or qualified documentation of service (e.g., Dept. of Defense Form DD-214, Discharge Documents, Active Service Documents, etc.)
- An official transcript from their college or university is required. For new applicants to a community
  college, high school transcripts or GED documentation must accompany the application along with their
  acceptance letter from the college/university.
- Two letters of recommendation (on letterhead for reference letters) with titles and contact information
  are also required. One letter of recommendation MUST be from a school advisor, counselor, dean of
  students, professor, etc. Letters of recommendation should demonstrate why a Scholarship should be
  awarded to the specific student.
- The application requires a short essay (2 pages or less, typed, double-spaced) highlighting why the
  recipient should be considered for this scholarship. The essay must address future plans as related to the
  applicant's selected program of study and must include pertinent information in assessing an applicant's
  other areas to include community service, activities, and work experience. The applicant must also
  address specifically how the Military has impacted their life and/or goals.
- All materials must be labeled with the applicant's name and postmarked by the deadline for consideration and selection.
- All materials should be sent by <u>May 1, 2025</u>, directly to:

The American Legion Auxiliary Department of Ohio has a program to assist students pursuing a degree in the nursing field. The scholarships are available from Department Headquarters: American Legion Auxiliary, Scholarship Coordinator PO Box 2760, Zanesville, Ohio 43702-2760 or can be downloaded from the <a href="https://www.alaohio.org">www.alaohio.org</a> web site found under the Scholarship tab. Local Auxiliary Units should contact their local high schools on the availability of this scholarship.

- The applicant must be an honorably discharged veteran or a spouse, son, or daughter (adopted, step, grand, or great-grand) of a living, deceased, or disabled honorably discharged veteran who served during these active war dates:
  - Due to the July 30, 2019, signing of the Let Everyone Get Involved with Opportunities for National Service – The LEGION ACT – eligibility for membership in The American Legion has been changed from the former seven war eras to two:
    - 1. April 6, 1917 Nov. 11, 1918
    - 2. Dec. 7, 1941 current.
- Attach to this application a photocopy of the veteran's <u>Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty</u> (<u>Form DD-214</u>) or other government document showing time served on active military duty during the eligibility period(s) indicated above.
- 3. The applicant must be a resident of Ohio.
- 4. The applicant must be sponsored by an Ohio American Legion Auxiliary Unit.
- The scholarship may be used at the nursing school of the student's choice. Proof of acceptance must be attached to application along with a current class schedule or current financial aid letter.
- 6. Accompanying the application must be three letters of recommendation from:
  - 1) A member of the clergy or a representative to attest to devotional beliefs.
  - 2) A representative of the community.
  - 3) The applicant stating his/her financial need and why he/she feels they are deserving of this scholarship.
- 7. The applicant must sign and date the application.
- 8. The completed application must be returned to the American Legion Auxiliary Unit by April 15, 2025.
- The Unit President must sign the application and forward it by <u>May 1, 2025</u>, with all supporting documents, to the Department Education Vice Chairman:

We are at the halfway point of our Auxiliary year, and it is time to review your income and spending during the last six months. Check to see how your figures align with your current unit budget. Make note of any major changes that will need to be considered when planning for next year. Below is a guideline that you may want to use as your unit begins preparation for the 2025-2026.

#### HOW TO SET GOALS THROUGH ANNUAL BUDGETING

Objective: Provide for financial stability by setting goals through the annual budget process.

#### Step-By-Step Instructions:

- Appoint a three-member Finance Committee for your Unit or some Units use their officers & committee chairs
- Conduct a budget planning meeting of the Finance Committee prior to the start of your fiscal
  year; make sure to invite Unit officers at which time the agenda should include, but not limited to
  the following:
  - Review your current financials in comparison to the IRS and nonprofit watchdog organizations' benchmarks (as mentioned in the "What Units Should Do" section of this POA).
  - o Review your progress status of your long-range goals.
  - Review your annual ALA obligations (use attached Donations Form as a guild, etc.)
  - o Review your annual operating expenses (bank fees, rent, utilities, conventions, etc.)
  - Review your membership numbers and related dues income.
  - Review other sources of revenue (donations, events, bequests)
  - o On a 12-month calendar, plot out when you anticipate your revenue and expenditures.
  - o Compare your total estimated revenue vs. your estimated expenses.
  - Determine which areas need further consideration to accomplish your long-range goals and meet the IRS and non-profit watchdog organizations' expense benchmarks.
- Try to create a positive bottom line. Remember, budgets are guidelines.
- The Finance Committee approves the budget and submits to the Unit for adoption.

## NATIONAL VETERANS CREATIVE ARTS FESTIVAL

I received the following from our Central Division VA&R Chairman Kristen Hensley regarding the American Legion Auxiliary Foundation grant information for VA&R.

It came from National Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Chair, Coral May Grout

The ALA Foundation supports Unit and Department involvement in the Festival through grants in the amount of \$2500. If three Units want to work together on a project, that means you can apply for \$7500. So, what can you do with the funds? You can purchase art supplies, jewelry supplies, music, and other items to support your local VA Facility and the veterans who are interested in participating. The winners may be chosen to attend the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, which will be held between May 11 through 18 in Indianapolis, IN.

Examples of approved grants over the past few years include: Department of Vermont to support marketing and implementation at the VA White River VCAF; New York Unit 1524 to provide awards and recognition to participants at the Syracuse VA Medical Center; and the Department of Nebraska to purchase art supplies and certificates for the Grand Island VA Medical Center's VCAF.

As VA Facilities are restarting many programs following COVID, these funds can be a real boost to jumpstart something wonderful for veterans!

The application is easy, yet only a total of 10 applications have been submitted over the past several years. If you are concerned about completing the paperwork,

There are two deadlines for submission of applications --- December 20th and March 20th.
