Auxiliary Brand Mark





Purpose of the Brand

The American Legion Auxiliary brand mark was created to address the need to modernize the American Legion Auxiliary brand to appeal to the next generation. Moreover, the new brand mark takes into consideration a host of applications that the original emblem could

never have anticipated. Those include digital and social media, special event and sports marketing, lifestyle apparel and more.

Brand Mark versus Emblem

Going forward, the brand mark is to be used in all marketing communications applications, while the emblem should be reserved for official documents and communications.

In application

The following guidelines offer direction in terms of when to use the emblem or one of the brand marks. While most applications will be clearly defined, inevitably some instances may straddle the line between two areas. In those cases, use discretion based on the intended audience. When choosing a brand mark option, default to what is most visually pleasing in that application. For example, the word mark should almost always be used in embroidery.

Brand Mark Options

- advertising
- apparel (use word mark for embroidery)
- business cards, letterhead, email signatures
- credentials, event badges
- press releases
- digital (apps, web, social, PowerPoint presentations)
- promotional communications (flyers, handouts, etc.)
- events (signs, backdrops, tents, tablecloths, swag/giveaways)

Emblem

- uniform caps
- financial documents
- history books
- flags
- legal affairs
- internal manuals & guides
- reports & resolutions
- awards (option emblem or brand)
- building signage (option emblem or brand)
- formal government communications (option emblem or brand)

Let us talk about the various parts of the Buckeye Girls State Tree:

The Seeds: Applications for Buckeye Girls State must be ordered no later than **February 15, 2025**, to get the "Buckeye Girls State Discount Rate" of \$350.00. After that date, the price changes to \$400.00

We can plant approximately 650 trees within this program and that is with the tedious labor of you the planters. Can you make this happen?

- Please use the material in the Buckeye Girls State Chairman Seed Packet to your advantage. There are samples of letters to the schools and the sponsors.
- Remember the deadlines so this tree does not whither.
- Delegates must attend one of the orientations held throughout the state. There are approximately twenty different sessions for them to attend.

We, the laborers of the Buckeye Girls State tree are here to help, and we are only a phone call away. I know you can think of different media groups to promote our program. We need everyone's helping to spread the leaves of the tree into a flowering tree and set high in the orchard.

- Buckeye Girls State will be held at Bowling Green State University—June 8-14-2025.
- Last but certainly now least—please set aside a donation in your budget for the BGS Endowment Fund so we can continue to provide scholarships to the delegates.



The trees are about to show us how lovely it is to let things go!



CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS KAREN PEEL – CHAIRMAN

Constitution & By-Laws is **not** a really exciting program, but it is a necessary one.

It is important that each Unit has an updated constitution & by-laws. So get started now. Do not wait until the last minute. Updated documents will help your unit to run smoothly. Once you have updated your constitution & by-laws and standing rules, make sure that they are available to all your members. Department can only accept, not approve your constitution & by-laws and standing rules. Also – Department, district, county, and unit documents cannot be in conflict with the National governing documents.

When National updates their governing documents, department, district, county, and units should automatically update their governing documents.

Attached to the plan of action is a sample constitution & by-laws to use as a guide. There is also information on how to write standing rules.

Things to include in your standing rules:

- Day and hour of your meeting and the location. Do you meet 12 months out of the year?
- Dues Senior and junior
- Elections:

When will elections be held?

Secretary and/or treasurer – elected or appointed?

Nominating committee – yes or no? Elected per the most recent edition of Roberts Rules.

- Election of delegates to Department convention, fall conference, district meetings. When and how they are selected.
- Installation of officers when, where, and who is in charge?
- Finances:

Rent

Utilities

Working funds for officers, chairmen, poppy purchases, Girls State, VA & R, etc.

Annual gift for District President's visit, retiring officer, etc.

Flowers and/or gifts for illness, death, etc.

Expenses for delegates to Department Convention, fall conference, district meetings, etc.

How are bills paid?

Department or District mandatory funds

Annual donations to special programs

Fiscal year (dates)

Audit


You can also add standing rules that pertain to your unit. Again – this will help your unit to run smoothly.

The National Historian, Dara Oliver of the Department of Florida held a zoom conference for Department Historians. She requested that a mid-winter report be submitted by December 1st. Please send your report of what your unit or district did from installation of your unit up to December 1st to me, along with any of your members biographies.

Her message also included:

- 1) The historian resources available to all historians can be found at www.alaforveterans.org. If you have not created an account, please do this. Once you have access, go to the area for historians. Do not worry about past dates, as this section is updated regularly, and some dates reflect the origination of when the section was created. The content is still invaluable.
- 2) Communication is key. I am available to help you with your history program by phone, email, mail, text, via Facebook, and in person. I have made visits to individual units and or districts to attend Birthday celebrations or special events. I have also visited district conferences to talk about the history program.
- 3) Know the difference between the History, and Scrapbook. The History Book is a narrative of events that occurred in the unit during the year. There are specific instructions to follow, and an award is given at the end of the year. The Scrapbook is a pictorial of the unit's events, and while there are specific instructions, the award is given at the end of the year but does not necessarily compete with the Best All Around History Plaque.

As the unit historian, you are the guardian of the records of your unit's events and activities. You are also to have photos of the events and activities of the members, and those who you are serving or are participating in at the event. Keep a journal by chronological order (by date in which it happened). Collect the handout of the event, and the dates, location and names of those in your photos. These tips are important for the history for publication or to archive.

- 2) Trick or treat in your neighborhood or at the VA clinic or hospital. Or trunk or treat in your legion parking lot with a costume contest.

Suicide Awareness & Decreasing Mental Health Stigma

Step One: Have your junior Auxiliary members or junior high students create posters with facts about mental health. The posters should be informative and positive- no black, dark pictures. The focus is on respect and knowledge.

Step Two: Donate items to a mental health facility or a hospital for mental health patients to help them be more comfortable.

(Ask the facility for a list of items.)

Normalizing challenges with mental health is the key to reducing stigma. Encouraging respectful informed and researched conversations about mental health will help individuals struggling feel better about their own problems and those of others. Far too many young people are dealing with their mental health and unable to get the necessary HELP. We all have a role to play in supporting mental health illness and creating a world where we all thrive.

Your state legislators are spending most of their time in their districts. Some are campaigning for re-election; some are enjoying some rest and relaxation (R&R), and some have been holding district open houses or town hall meetings for their constituents. We know what they are not doing. Holding committee hearings and full sessions. But that does not mean they are not working. They still have offices with staff members to run and many are still sending out newsletters and attending various meetings. What does that all mean for the veterans of Ohio and our active-duty members? The next couple of months is an extremely important time. It is when they should be the most active in the legislative process.

The first thing to consider is the November election. There are 99 districts in the Ohio House of Representatives and 33 districts in the Ohio Senate. Elections are being held for all 99 house districts and the even numbered districts in the senate. Many districts have incumbents running but there are a lot of new names on ballots as well. It is important to pay attention and do as much homework as possible before the election. The outcome of the November election will affect us all for the next four years and beyond.

November 5th is about two months away. I suggest that every Ohio voter find their county board of elections website and look up a sample ballot so they will know who is running and for which offices (they might be surprised to learn there are eleven individuals running for President?). Look up the issues also. They could impact your future over the next several years-or longer.

- * Make a list of who you are voting for.
- * You are now an educated voter.

Going back to the basics with Membership 101:

Membership in The American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the:

- (1) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, daughters and granddaughters and direct and adopted female descendants of members of The American Legion; and
- (2) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, daughters and granddaughters and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who served in either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918 and any time after December 7, 1941 who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge;
- (3) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, daughters and granddaughters and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941 who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge; and
- (4) to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.

Other factors to consider when determining membership eligibility:

- When a request for ALA membership is based on the military service of a family member who is still living, that family member must be a current member of The American Legion before the female relative or spouse may join.
- When a request for ALA membership is based on a deceased veteran the prospective member will be asked to provide verifying documentation that proves his/her eligibility (see acceptable documentation below).
- When a female veteran applies to join the ALA without being a member of The American Legion, she is eligible to join if her service dates fall within one (1) of the eligible service periods as described in the National Constitution. However, should her family members (including spouse) wish to join the ALA or the Sons of The American Legion through her service, she must first become a member of The American Legion.

The following documents are acceptable to verify membership eligibility in the ALA:

- 1. DD214 discharge papers (not issued until after the Korean War)
- 2. Official military orders
- 3. Official military service citations/awards
- 4. Letters related to the veteran's military service. Must be on official government letterhead.
- 5. Certificate from the VA records center in St. Louis 6. Data from the back of older discharges

Have you reviewed ALL your Governing Documents? Do they all coordinate correct information with each other? Do your members and officers know their responsibilities on how to handle a meeting? Here's some GREAT INFORMATION **YOU** should read and know.

Basic Parliamentary Principles facilitate your meeting and protect the members rights. Parliamentary procedure is based on Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

Eight Steps in Processing a Main Motion

- Step 1: Member rises and addresses the chair when nothing is pending. "Mr. President." Or "Madame President."
- Step 2: Chair recognizes member by nodding at the member or stating his name. "Mr. Williams." Step 3: Member states his/her motion. "I move that we have a canned food drive."
- Step 4: Another member seconds the motion (without recognition). "Second." Step 5: Chair states the motion and places it before the assembly for discussion. "It is moved and seconded that we have a canned food drive. Is there any discussion?"
- Step 6: Members have the right to get recognition and debate the motion. During debate subsidiary motions (i.e. amendments) may be introduced to help the assembly make a final decision.

- Step 7: When discussion is finished the Chair puts the question to a vote. "The question is on the adoption of the motion that we have a canned food drive. Those in favor, say AYE." (Pause.) "Those opposed, say NO." (Pause.)
- Step 8: Chair announces the results of the vote. "The AYES (NOES) have it; the motion is adopted (lost); we will (not) have a canned food drive; the next business in order is ..."

Methods of Voting

- Unanimous Consent no member objects to a proposal that meets with general approval; a vote of silent agreement.
- Voice Vote regular method of voting on any motion that does not require more than a majority vote; most common form of voting.
- Rising Vote method used when a two-thirds vote is required for adoption; is also used when a member calls for a division of the assembly.
- Show of Hands or Voting Cards an alternative method for a rising vote.
- Counted Vote can be ordered by the chair when it appears a voice vote is unclear and it can be ordered by a majority vote of the assembly.
- Ballot or Roll Call Vote can be ordered by a majority vote of the assembly and is required if specified in bylaws.

COMMON DEFINITIONS

- Parliamentary procedure: Rules by which meetings of deliberative assemblies, societies, boards, clubs, etc. are formally conducted.
- Chair: Short form of the word "chairman," used to refer to the member conducting the meeting. Chair, chairman and chairperson are all correct and may be sed at the preference of the chair.
- Gavel: The traditional mallet used by the presiding officer to keep order. It is to be used on the table and not on the members.
- Quorum: The number of the members needed to conduct business. Quorum cannot be suspended.
- Agenda: A list of the order of business to be considered. (usually set by the Chair and recommended that each member at the meeting receive a copy)
- Minutes: A record of the meeting kept by the secretary.
- Amendment: A specific proposal to change an organization entity/governance documents.
