Anyone, not just members, can volunteer for the Auxiliary.

The Auxiliary can grow volunteer numbers through targeting these groups:

- Family members of active military
 - Women veterans
 - 20-45 age group
- Women whose father or mother was/is in the military
 - Students
 - Professional occupations
 - Faith-based groups

What can be done to entice eligible women from these groups of people to join our organization?

- Visit your local military base.
- * Service members are encouraged to volunteer to help each other and the community. For the Army, contact either the Installation Volunteer Coordinator (the Army Community Service Office) or the Commander of the Installation. For the Navy, contact either the Ombudsman Office or the Family Service Center. For the Air Force and the Marines, contact the Family Support Center Director. For the Coast Guard, contact the Morale, Welfare and Recreation office. Spouse clubs on the base can be contacted directly.
- * Plan a meet-and-greet near a base, invite families to attend and distribute contact information (but no membership applications).
- Tap into the college community service scene.
- * There are several service-oriented organizations on college campuses looking for their next volunteer opportunity. Why not suggest they volunteer to help out veterans or their families? The Auxiliary can make itself known on college campuses nationwide and become synonymous with service. Refer

to the Volunteer section of "Engage to Retain" for some excellent examples of potential volunteer opportunities.

- Reach out to local professionals.
- * There are many doctors, lawyers, accountants, chefs, teachers, etc., who would love nothing more than to volunteer their services to give back to veterans in their communities. Recruit them to take part in a stand down, help veterans with their taxes or cook at a local Fisher House. They will see the good work the Auxiliary is doing and want to come back to help again!
- Make yourselves visible in your community.
- * Whether helping out at a local nonprofit, or sponsoring an Auxiliary event, no one will know the Auxiliary exists if you aren't out serving your community and making people wonder how they can get involved, too.
- Tell your friends.
- * When it comes to recruitment, we are our own worst enemy. We don't like to brag about what the Auxiliary does. But if you joined, your family and friends might like it, too. If you tell your friends, then they tell their friends, think of all of the people you just reached by having one conversation.

Finally, do not think of seeking out target groups as recruiting members. We are recruiting volunteers who want to help veterans through our great organization, and if they are eligible and would like to join, that is a wonderful result.

Helpful Hints in Writing a Narrative Story

To share with your Units


- The word narrative often panics people. Don't let it! You are really writing a story about what your unit did or if it's a member specific award, what they did for the program.
- Think of a member you have not seen for a long time. Here's your chance to tell that member what has been happening in the unit for the year.
- Review and read thoroughly and carefully the Program Action Plan awards...there will be two types you can submit National and Department. Each has different criteria.
- Where to start:
 - Go to the Program Action Plan section What Can You Do? There are lots of ideas for the member and the unit. These are great memory joggers.
 - When you find the "What Can You Do" section, you will see there are subtitles on what to accomplish...go to the ideas for members and unit under that subtitle. Use these as reference points.
 - Once you have gone through all the subtitles and determine the activities needed for your "story", start writing the who, what, when, where and how.
 - Be very specific in your writing. Try to write in the 3rd person...not my or I, but the unit, chairman or member. If the award is member specific, you will have to mention the name.
 - You will not get it right on the first writing...it may take 3 or more times...start early...write then walk away...come back reread and rewrite...suggest you put a Revision on each copy just in case you removed something and now you want it back.
 - Once you think it's ready, let another member read it. You'll be surprised at what you may have forgotten.

ON YOUR REPORTS

ALL ZEROS OR ALL BLANKS DOES NOT CONSTITUTE A REPORT

REMEMBER: (1) If a project crosses two Programs you can: (a) only claim all dollars and hours on one program or (b) divide the dollars and hours between the 2 programs.

- (2) Buckeye Girls State has its own report...should not be counted on Americanism
- (3) When submitting a report, fill out all the upper area blanks...that includes your District & Unit Number; Membership Goal; Membership Total As of Report; Name of person completing the report; mark with the individual is the President or Chairman; Phone number; Email Address; Membership ID (its on your card); If applying for an Award-it's name BASICALLY EVERYTHING AT THE TOP!
- (4) IMPACT REPORT...some reports need an impact report filled out by Unit President. There is a stamp on the front page of the Report Form that indicates Impact Report is needed
- (5) All Report Forms are not the same. SO READ THEM CAREFULLY.

LEADERSHIP AWARDS

REPORT DUE – 15 APRIL END OF YEAR REPORT AND OR AWARD NARRATIVE – 15 APRIL

Annual reports reflect the program work of units in the department, and may result in a national award for participants if award requirements are met. UNITS should submit this report to the Department Leadership Chairman by April 15, 2019. Use the "What Can I You Do" as a guide as well as a memory jogger. This report could be as short as a few sentences, a paragraph, or 1000 words...JUST TELL ME YOUR LEADERSHIP STORY. (EMAIL REPORTS ARE ACCEPTED)

The Plea from National:

We were watching with prayers and worry as we've seen the flooding in the Midwest. We've seen the aftermath on the news. Here is information about Emergency Grants offered to ALA members in cases of natural disasters like this. I know you already know but I created this quick reminder with all of the links and directions in an email for disasters:

The EXPEDITED DISASTER AEF application goes straight to us here at National (unlike the regular AEF application that has to be signed off on by the unit and the department.)

Online: go to: https://www.alaforveterans.org/Expedited-Application-for-Members-Affected-by-Disaster/ and

- login to the Members Only Portal. Members will need to create their free log-in if they haven't already done so.
- If following the link above to the application, once logged in, you will be directed to the <u>AEF</u>
 <u>Committee page</u> where you can click on a link to complete the online EXPEDITED DISASTER application or print it off.

By Mail/Fax/Email:

- The printable version of the AEF disaster application is attached (and also available on the national website at https://www.alaforveterans.org/Members/Auxiliary-Emergency-Fund/.)
- You can print a copy of the application, fill out as much detail as possible and provide any available documentation, such as photos and copies of repair estimates.
- Expedited disaster applications do not require signatures from the member's unit and/or department.
- After completing the application, you can submit it by:

Education Deb Meyer, Chairman

As part of the ALA Education program and Goal 2 of our ALA Centennial Strategic Plan, celebrating Teacher Appreciation Week during May 6-10, 2019 is a great way for units to promote the program. Teacher Appreciation Week is a nice way to thank those people who spend tireless hours preparing for class and getting our children and grandchildren ready for the future ahead of them. Teaching is not what it was when I first started teaching 45 years ago. I was able to concentrate on teaching but now so much emphasis is put testing. Teachers, besides being ready for class and teaching, they have to spend countless hours on preparing students for testing. Teacher Appreciation Week give us all a chance to say "Thank you for all you do" to all those teachers who do so much for our children and grandchildren.

Medal of Honor Foundation was founded by the Congressional Medal of Honor Society, which consists exclusively of the living recipients of the Medal of Honor. The Foundation is dedicated to educating and inspiring Americans about the values embodied in the Medal of Honor: courage and sacrifice, commitment and integrity, citizenship and patriotism. The Congressional Medal of Honor Society with a broad range of initiatives such as the Medal of Honor Character Development Program, scholarship programs, exhibits and multimedia projects are aimed at increasing awareness of the Medal of Honor and what it represents. I first heard about the Foundation several years ago on the inspiring America segment of the nightly news so I checked out the website and found some very interesting information. First of all you can have Medal of Honor recipients speak to school groups. There is important protocol to follow which is listed on the website. The last I looked Ohio has two veterans who were awarded the Medal of Honor, one from the Cleveland area and the other from Columbus. There is a character and leadership development program with lesson plans for teachers to follow that educate students about veterans and their service and to help develop the students' leadership skills. There are forty-two lesson, I know no teacher has time to do all of them but maybe they could pick out a couple that would viable in their classroom. One of our language arts teacher decided to do a couple with her students for journal writings. Periodically, there are webinar discussions of historical events that history or government teachers might be able to use in their classrooms. You can sign up for their newsletter at http://themedalofhonor.com It is something worth checking out and letting our educator know what is available to them.

The scholarship applications are in the process of being evaluated. National winners will be notified by Central Division sometime in May. All other winners will be announced at the Summer Department Convention. Hopefully Past President Parley Scholarship forms have been taken to the schools. Those applications are due **May 1, 2019**.

Students will begin statewide testing in the next couple of weeks. There will be students who come to school without breakfast only to sit through several hours of testing hungry. Our school has an organization that see each child has a granola bar and juice box each day of testing so all children have something in the stomachs before testing starts each morning. Check with your schools and see how you can help with such a project. If there is no such project in your school, is this something your unit could do? We all want to see that our students have the best advantages when they are testing.

Community Service By Pam Brenneman

Many of our nation's veterans need assistance around their home. Elderly or limited-mobility veterans may not be able to take care of all their housekeeping requirements and would appreciate some extra help. Knowing that veterans and current service members do not always come to the Auxiliary in times of need, here are a few places where you can go to share our mission and help veterans who may need some help at home. This type of volunteer work is known as field service. Often, organizations or individuals aware of a veteran's issues will either encourage them to contact us or share his/her information with the local Auxiliary unit. In this manner, volunteers can be matched with veterans in need of help around the house.

How to Find Veterans:

- 1. In order to find veterans in need of help around the house, contact local Vet Centers and the state-level Veterans Administration office. Many of these state offices are located at Veterans Affairs Medical Centers (VAMCs). Express to them that the Auxiliary unit is looking to assist disabled veterans around their homes.
- 2. Contact your local Operation Homefront by visiting www.operationhomefront.net. Operation Homefront provides assistance to deployed and wounded servicemembers and their families.
- 3. Be sure let the Legion, SAL and Riders (if applicable) in your area (especially at your post home) know what your unit is planning. They may know of a veteran who could use your help and/or be willing to volunteer to help on your project.

Ways to Help Veterans at Home:

- Basic home repairs (e.g., painting a room or the exterior of a house).
- Seasonal yard work (e.g., snow removal, raking leaves, weeding or mowing the lawn).
- Build a wheelchair ramp for a veteran who has lost a leg or an elderly veteran who is less mobile.
- Cook a meal for them at their home.
- Do their laundry or housecleaning,

Spirit Of Community Plaque—A plaque will be presented to the Unit with the best narrative on a Community Service PROJECT involving the Unit and other organizations.
