National Executive Committee Members and Department Secretaries:

The IRS regulation concerning auxiliaries to veteran service organizations states in part: "At least 75 percent of its members are veterans, spouses of veterans, or related to a veteran within two degrees of consanguinity (i.e., grandparent, brother, sister, grandchild represent the most distant allowable relationships)."

This has been a regulation for many years, and with the recent review of the Auxiliary eligibility criteria, the issue was evaluated, and the decision was to ensure the organization was compliant.

This means that no great or great-granddaughters can join the Auxiliary. Current members whose eligibility relationship is great-granddaughter, great-granddaughter or direct descendent can continue being a member, as long as their dues are kept current.

In order to align with IRS regulations, the most distant allowable will be granddaughter. Great-granddaughter, great-granddaughter and direct descendent will no longer be available for selection on the relationship tab in ALAMIS.

Membership applications available for download off the website have already been updated. Print applications in the form of our ALA at a Glance and TAL Family brochure will be updated as stock is depleted.

Currently we have:

- 8,649 members designated as direct descendants
- 5,901 members designated as great-granddaughters
- 311 members designated as great-great-granddaughters

Total of 14, 861 = 2.5% of total membership

<u>Unit Award</u>. Active PR team Centennial Celebration. Award given to be determined at print time. Best narrative with (photos and media results) to convey the work of a unit public relations team (of no less than 3-members) of the Centennial Celebration as unit activities are publicized. THE UNIT PRESIDENT, SECRETARY, AND INVESTIGATOR WILL COMPLETE THE UNIT PORTION AND FORWARD THE APPLICATION TO THE ALA NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS.

WHAT IS COMMUNITY SERVICE AND WHO IS A VOLUNTEER

A volunteer is someone-not necessarily an American Legion Auxiliary memberwho has helped their community with a service or activity WITHOUT getting PAID for the service or activity that was completed by that person. The volunteers could be members of the community, American Legion Auxiliary, American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, Legion Riders, and anyone who contributed to the project that benefitted the community.

Community Service is an activity or project that benefits a community's needs by the volunteers. The finished project should be documented with the following information- total hours by volunteers, number of volunteers, what did you do?- in a narrative, and how much do you think you spent or had donated towards the project. This can be applied to all the programs of the American Legion Auxiliary. PLEASE DO NOT DOUBLE DIP INFORMATION IN REPORTING! This means that you can split the project between two ALA report areas with the each area getting some of the projects information and the total projects figures/information equals the total information on the individual project. Veterans will be served at these events and if you want to try to count the veterans served- you can include it in your information about that individual project.

We would like to have these ready for our Veterans Affairs Medical Centers (VAMC) Hospital Representatives to take to their VAMCs by the end of our Department mid-winter meeting (January, so the R.A.C.E. is on!).

Be creative with your 100 items! For example, if you can't afford packs of diapers (who can?) donate a package of diapers and some diaper creams to get you to your items. Partner with other units in your District to get to items; invite your Legion and Sons of the American Legion (SAL) to help you R.A.C.E. in your quest to get items to donate. Put out a donation box for items or donation can to help with purchases. Don't think we are limiting your donations to items! We are just incorporating the celebration of our 100-year anniversary into our projects.

Some of you are thinking, "we don't have an active Junior group and do not have meetings." Well, if you have a Junior member in your unit or a young SAL member, ask that Junior or SAL member to participate and ask for items. Just because you do not have an "active" Junior group and do not have meetings, doesn't mean your individual Junior or young SAL member can't do something to participate! You must make him or her aware of what can be done to make a difference! One Junior member participating is all you need to have activity and something to report of Junior Activities...It is not quantity, but quality that makes things happen! Once one Junior member or one young SAL member starts being active, the others will want to be a part of this. District Fall Conferences are coming up, get the word out and please ask your units to bring some items for these projects! Some examples of items: lotions, shampoos, shower gels, brushes, foot care products and baby items.


LAP TWO (2) WHAT YOUR UNIT CAN DO TO PROMOTE PARTICIPATION

Ladies...start your engines!!! President Kristin's theme is <u>R.A.C.E. for our veterans</u>. Two parts of this theme are <u>Care and Educate</u>. As members of the ALA, we can promote and help to secure our national security through caring and educating.

We show that we <u>CARE</u> for veterans, military members, their families, and our communities by caring for their needs. Showing that you care can be done in a variety of ways:

- Sending care packages to military members
- Supporting Honor Flight
- Donating blank greeting cards and postage stamps to a VAMC
- Supporting the family of a deployed military member

We are in an excellent position to <u>EDUCATE</u> our community. Some suggestions include:

- Organize and work at your post's POW/MIA ceremony (typically the 3rd Friday in September)
- Host a community training for FEMA preparation and/or CPR/First Aid
- Host an information session to help community members be prepared in advance for a disaster

In all of the above, you can educate about the ALA by wearing your ALA brand items: t-shirts, name badges, officer pins, etc. Carry one or two applications in your purse. Be ready to share a few brief items about the ALA: why you are member or what your favorite activity is.

As a reminder: <u>Mid-Year reports are due to me no later than December 1, 2019</u>. It is a very easy thing to do. Simply write a few sentences about the activities your unit has done regarding National Security. Think of how you would explain to someone who is unfamiliar with National Security. Five or six sentences can tell a lot to others.

Do not forget: plan to "host" a package party for deployed military. This year at our Mid-Winter conference, there will be a Department National Security Chairman's Special Award presented to the unit that sends a narrative on the designated activity. **The deadline for sending a story of this activity is January 3, 2020.** I am looking for units who coordinate, collect, assemble, and send service care packages to military members. The criteria for the narrative story includes: the number of packages assembled **and** sent, the number of volunteers, and the estimated value of the packages. Feel free to include pictures! Information is also in the National Security POA.

For those who are on social media, the National Security program has a Facebook page for members. Go to the National web site @ www.alaforveterans.org click on the media tab at the top, and then scroll down the page to ALA Facebook Groups, and click on ALA National Security. Follow the prompts for signing up. The Facebook page is a great tool for exchanging ideas regarding National Security.



Special 100th Anniversary History Program Facts:

The Remembrance Red Poppy began on Saturday, Nov. 9, 1918, as a memorial to those who sacrificed their lives in WWI, after Ms. Moina Belle Michael read a poem written by Lt. Col. McCrae entitled, "We Shall Not Sleep" (later entitled "In Flanders Field") in the November issue of Ladies Home Journal while she was on duty at the 25th Conference of the Overseas YMCA. Ms. Michael's desk was located in a room called GEMOT, a get-together place where servicemen said farewell to family members. She purchased twenty-five poppies and distributed them to the businessmen in New York attending the conference.

In her autobiography, "The Miracle Flower", she described how the idea came to her after she read Lt. McCarae's poem. Ms. Michael went on to lead a campaign for the adoption of the official flower of The American Legion Family to memorialize the soldiers who served during WWI.

For almost 100 years, 100% of the funds raised through the distribution of poppies by American Legion members has exclusively supported active-duty military, veterans and their families. National Poppy Day is celebrated on the Friday before Memorial Day.

Veteran's Day is right around the corner. It is another great opportunity to promote the Poppy program. If you are having a Veteran's Day program, you can offer Poppies at your event. Poppies can be offered at any time — not just in May.

Check out Pinterest for coloring pages for all ages! Take them to schools or use them during a Junior meeting.

Don't forget to get your poppy orders into Department by December 31st. You must purchase poppies by December 31st in order for your Unit to qualify for a Citation of Merit.


Calling all crafters!!! Centennial Poppy Special Project
