 - **b.** Action Step: While displaying poppies at community events, include a poppy can for donations. Also include information on how the money collected will be used.
 - **c.** Action Step: Create and display poppy items at community events that are sold to benefit the poppy fund.
 - **d.** Action Step: During community events, share the history of the poppy and the importance of the poppy as a symbol for the American Legion Auxiliary.
- 2. Objective Goal: Inform the community and members about National Poppy Day, May 27, 2022.
 - **a.** Action Step: Send a poppy days news release to local media. See template at <u>www.legion-aux.org/member/committees/poppy/poppy-days</u>.
 - **b.** Action Step: Send a copy of a poppy proclamation to city officers, (see above web address) when complete, share it with local media.

Annual reports reflect the program work of units in the department and may result in a national award for participants if award requirements are met. Each Unit Poppy chairman is required to submit a narrative report by <u>April 15, 2022</u>, to the Department Poppy Chairman. (address on front of POA)

NATIONAL AWARD INFORMATION & DEADLINE

Most Outstanding Unit Poppy Program – one per division. The Unit Poppy Award Plaque winner will be sent on to National to compete for this National Award.

Little Miss Poppy – see the criteria listed under Department Award Information & Deadline for specific guidelines and requirements.

Poppy Poster Contest – see the criteria listed under Department Award Information & Deadline for specific guidelines and requirements.

DEPARTMENT AWARD INFORMATION AND DEADLINE

Unit Poppy Award – The Unit Poppy Chairman will submit an entry for judging.

- The Unit Poppy in each class reporting their Best Unit Poppy Program will receive an award at Department Summer Convention.
- Each entry should cover all phases of the Poppy Program.
- Each entry must be typewritten in narrative form, not to exceed 1,000 words and include a completed National Cover Sheet. Please include word count.
- Entry to be judged at department level and may be sent to National for further judging.
- Entry is due to the Department Poppy Chairman by <u>April 15, 2022</u>.

Little Miss Poppy Contest – Ages 6-12

- Participants must be between 6 and 12 years of age and be a Junior member in good standing of the American Legion Auxiliary.
- Promotional activity of the Poppy story must occur through the American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, and the community.
- A Miss Poppy Scrapbook (8-1/2" x 11" format) must be submitted containing photographs and clippings illustrating how she promoted the American Legion Auxiliary poppy in her community.
- Although every effort will be made to return the scrapbook, accidents do happen, so all entrants must allow for that risk. Scrapbooks will be returned at Department Convention.
- Judging Scrapbook criteria:
 - Scrapbook must be the original work from the Junior Little Miss Poppy and adhere to size requirements as listed above. (may have help from an adult)
 - Costume (no specific dress code or particular dress color).
 - Promotion of the Poppy Program What did you share and do?
 - Publicity of Poppy activities (newspapers, radio/TV, etc.)
 - o Narrative report on 'What I Have Learned Being Miss Poppy.'
 - Essay on 'Memorial Poppy' not to exceed 100 words.
 - The memorial poppy must be visible in all promotion and publicity submitted.
 - Neatness and creativity.
 - Cover page to include member name, unit name, state, age division and year.
 - Judging scale will be 1 through 10 for each area of entire entry.
- The Department Little Miss Poppy winner will be forwarded to compete for the National award. If a National winner, Little Miss Poppy will be invited to appear at the ALA National Convention, immediately following her selection, and if so chooses, will travel at her own expense.
- Selection of the Unit Little Miss Poppy is at the discretion of the Unit.
- Winner of the Department Little Miss Poppy contest will receive a citation plaque.
- Scrapbook due to Department Poppy Chairman by April 15, 2022.

Poppy Poster Contest – Each Unit is asked to sponsor a Poppy Poster Contest in their local schools or with Junior members. The Unit chooses their winning entry and must be sent to Department Poppy Chairman by **April 15, 2022**.

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Contest classes are:

Class I	Grades 2 & 3
Class II	Grades 4 & 5
Class III	Grades 6 & 7
Class IV	Grades 8 & 9



Class V	Grades 10 & 11
Class VI	Grade 12
Class VII	Students with *Special Needs
*Special Needs is defined as:	

- Those in special education classes
- A student recommended for special education classes but who has not been admitted due to waiting list or various other factors
- A child identified as having a disability, but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities. Identification contingent upon discretion of school officials.

Poppy Poster Requirements

- Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed ten (10) words. The articles "a, and, an, the" are *not counted* as words. The words "buddy" and "buy", *cannot* be used.
- The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the (10) word count.
- Each poster must include a picture of the red Flanders Field poppy.
- The poster shall be on 11"x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted).
- The United States flag may be used, as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- Judging Criteria
 - ✓ 50% Poster Appeal (layout, message, originality)
 - ✓ 40% Artistic Ability (design and color)
 - ✓ 10% Neatness
- Media used shall be watercolor, crayon, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils, or markers.
- *Written in ink* on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- Submissions become the property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians' grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.
- The poster shall be the work of only one individual.
- The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy *may not be used*.
- While ALA representatives will do their best to return all posters, it is not guaranteed. We recommend participants take a picture or scan their poster for their records.

The Shelley Riggs Plaque - Best All-Around Poppy Program

- A plaque will be awarded to the Unit who submits a *SCRAPBOOK* based on the "Best All-Around Poppy Program."
- Scrapbook must be 8-1/2" X 11" with cover page to include: Unit name and number, address, District number, creator's name, and the date. Scrapbook should include photos, articles, newspaper clippings and a 250 word essay on how your Unit promoted the Poppy Program.
- Scrapbooks will be returned at Department Convention or given to the District President.
- Scrapbooks should be sent to the Department Poppy Chairman by April 15, 2022.

Senior Poppy Usage Contest

The Senior Poppy Usage Contest will be held at the Mid-Winter Conference January 24-25, 2022. The entries are designs of your own choosing using official ALA poppies and it may be any of the following nature: wreaths, centerpieces, tray favors, etc. This is an opportunity for you to share with other Units our creative ideas. Attendees at the Conference will vote by a \$1.00 contribution per vote.

- All money collected will go to the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival.
- A photo of the entry that brought in the most money will be highlighted in the Buckeye Messenger.
- If your Unit has an entry, but no one is coming to Mid-Winter, try to send with a Unit who is attending.

Senior Poppy Corsage Contest

Get your creative side juices flowing!!!! The Senior Poppy Corsage Contest will be held at the Mid-Winter Conference January 24-25, 2022. The entries are designs of your own choosing using official ALA poppies. Attendees at the Conference will vote by a \$1.00 contribution per vote.

- Each corsage should have the name of the creator, their Unit and District.
- Size: Be approximately 3 ½ x 3 ½ and fit in a standard 4" x 4" corsage box. Any larger will be disqualified.
- Corsages will be used at 2022 Buckeye Girls State Session for the City Mayor's.
- If your Unit has an entry, but no one is coming to Mid-Winter, try to send with a Unit who is attending.
- Please note: All Poppy corsages will not be returned unless that is noted at the time your entry is received.

Junior Poppy Usage Contest

The Junior Poppy Usage Contest will be held at the Mid-Winter Conference January 24-25, 2022. The entries are designs of your own choosing using official ALA poppies and it may be any of the following nature: wreaths, centerpieces, tray favors, etc. This is an opportunity for you to share with other Junior Units our creative ideas.
