- 7. How many prayers did your unit send in for the special certificate by the ten of each month?
- 8. Did any of your members help out and mentored a Junior member in putting a new prayer together for their prayer book using the presidents theme?

I would like to have more prayers sent to me for our President's Prayer Book. These need to be in my hand by June 1, 2022.

I would like to thank those that have sent in prayer already, devotions are also accepted. I hope to have one hundred percent in reporting and many prayer books to judge. Let us put a great pray book together for our President Colleen.

#### Children and Youth

Hopefully spring is around the corner and April will be here before we know it. It is time to start planning for your children and youth events for National Children and Youth Month. Yes, you can plan an Easter event or Easter egg hunt but there are other events that can be part of the month of April. Make sure if you have military families in your community that you do something special for them. The children of military families make sacrifices that other children to not have to contend with. The parents might be deployed or their families might be on the move every few years. It is hard to make lifelong friends if your family is moving every two or three years. April 15, 2022 is Military Children's Day and good day to honor those children. Don't forget to encourage your unit's members and the community to wear purple on April 15<sup>th</sup>. Put an article in the local paper explaining that you wear purple on the 15<sup>th</sup> of April to honor military children.

I have always thought April is a good time to hold a summer safety event for children including such things as bicycle safety, water safety, how to be safe in a crowd, etc. Contact your local police department for help and life guards from your local pools or YMCA. Many police department will help you organize a bicycle rodeo. Maybe get your county sheriff's department to do a K-9 demonstration. Have a craft and refreshments and presto, you have an event.

Whatever you choose to do, it will take planning so now is the time to start so you are ready in April. You will not be able to use these events on this year's reporting but will go on next year's reports. Take pictures and write a narrative about it once it is over so the information will be ready for next year. Make sure to put articles and pictures in the local media and post it on Facebook.

April is also a good month to hold an event or collection for the Child Welfare Fund. As I have explained in the Buckeye Messenger and at Mid-winter, there is a label that can be downloaded from the National website that with a little trimming it fits around a tall potato chip can. They can be placed in your post or at the place where people will pay when attending the many fish fries that many post will be holding in the next couple of months. After my presentation at Mid-Winter, one member came up to say they had monthly dinners and she was going to see if the proceeds from one of the dinners could go to the CWF. Great idea! Did you know that a 16-ounce water bottle filled with dimes is right around a \$100? Pass the bottle at your unit or district meetings. Any money collected and sent to Department by June 1, 2022 will be counted towards the Leta Zeller Plague to be awarded at the Department Summer Convention so you still have a couple of months to collect for the CWF.

Soon, we will all begin preparing for reporting. It is very important that we work to get 100% reporting. District chairman as the April 15th deadline approaches that might mean you will need to contact those units that have not sent you a report. Every unit has the 25-cents per member to report. It will be important for District chairman to outline the awards and what units need to report at the District Roundtables. I would love to see the Department of Ohio have 100% reporting for Children and Youth but District Chairman, I will need your help.

The awards for the Children and Youth program are:

Leta Zeller Plaque – This plaque will be presented at Department Convention to the District President with the "Highest Percentage" of Units contributing to The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation by June 1st. Department Headquarters will calculate all donations and determine winner.

Miriam Junge Plaque — This plaque will be presented at Department Convention to the Unit Chairman promoting the most outstanding report for the "Best Year-Round Children & Youth Program." All entries are to be sent by April 15, 2022, to District Children & Youth Chairman. District Chairman will send all winning entries to Department Chairman by May 1, 2022, along with report forms. <u>PLEASE</u> make sure this report goes first to the District chairman and do not send it to the Department Chairman.

Certificate of Participation – A Certificate of Participation will be awarded at the Department Summer Convention for those Units who submit a narrative which tells how they celebrated the children and youth of their community with three (3) events during the year. This report must be a typed narrative of 300 words or less. Please include photographs and news articles. The narrative is to be sent to the Children & Youth Chairman, Deb Meyer, 90 N. Lincoln St., Minster, OH 45865 by April 15, 2022.

Youth Hero and Good Deed Award forms can be found on the ALA website. Once the form has been completed and signed by the unit, it is sent to American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Ohio, PO Box 2760, Zanesville, OH 43702-2760, Attn. Department Secretary. The Department Secretary will certify the application and forward it to National Headquarters. The National President will sign the award and return it to be presented to the youth.

If you unit is awarding the Youth Caregiver Certificate to children and youth in your community, those certificates can be found on the ALA National website.

Our Auxiliary year is winding down, but service to our communities never ends! There is still plenty of time to do something special at a local senior center, nursing home, library, for first responders, etc. Don't forget National Volunteer Week is April 17<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup>. Be sure to wear Auxiliary apparel all the time and let people know who the American Legion Auxiliary is, and what we do.

It was good to see those who attended Mid-Winter Conference. Rosie ("City Slicker Health Care Worker") and Becky (From "Down on the Farm" like Bob Evans) had a lot of fun talking to the members about Community Service. For those who couldn't attend, here's a recap:

First responders are putting in VERY LONG HOURS. Make a dinner in disposable containers and take to their homes. No cooking and no clean up! Invite them to a dinner at your Post and serve them for free. OR make up carryouts and deliver to them. Drop off some treats or food to your local police and fire departments. St. Patrick's Day and Easter are going to be here before we know it. Host an appreciation dinner and invite theses first responders to attend. Make sure you include your junior members to help with these events.

If your local high school has a drug and alcohol-free After Prom, see what you can do to help with it. Monetary donations, make and donate food, etc. Don't forget to invite these same high school students to help with events you hold at your Posts and Units. Support Storytimes at the Library.

Concentrate on the new Mental Health Initiative for Community Service. Hold a fundraiser or make a donation earmarked for mental health to the Military Family Assistance Fund. This is also President Colleen's special project for the state of Ohio. Check in with local behavioral health facilities and/or the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services to see what their needs are.

The Ohio Disaster Emergency Assistance Program offers help to MEMBERS and UNITS directly involved in a disaster. Plan a fundraiser or donate to this fund. You will be helping fellow members in need as well as serving the community. What if we had a disaster like the tornadoes that devastated the southern states in Ohio? This fund would be there for those who needed it.

The Red Cross just announced a NATIONAL BLOOD SHORTAGE. The pandemic has caused a decline in blood donors, staff shortages, and forced cancellations of bloodmobiles. If your Unit is able to sponsor a bloodmobile, contact your local Red Cross chapter and set one up. If you are able to donate blood, find a bloodmobile in your area and give. Live-saving blood is needed to save lives. "ALA Angels Serving Others" can not only make a difference, but save lives too!

#### DEPARTMENT JUNIOR CONVENTION RULES AND ORDER OF BUSINESS April 30, 2022

The Convention meetings shall be called to order at the designated time.

The Chair may deviate from the printed program when necessary.

The audience shall remain seated during the business of the Convention, unless participating in the program. No one shall be permitted to enter or leave the Convention hall during the presentation of awards, when a speaker has the floor, or during voting.

A member wishing to address the Convention shall rise, address the Chair and, when recognized, shall give her name, Unit, and District number before stating her business.

Only registered Delegates, or authorized Alternates acting as Delegates, seated in the assigned location, are eligible to vote.

An alternate replacing a delegate unable to attend the convention shall have her senior advisor notify the third member of the Department Junior Activities Committee, who is in charge of the registration committee.

All Junior and Senior members shall observe appropriate conduct and dress during Department Junior Convention.

The District Junior Activities Chairman or the Senior District President shall be the adult advisor for the District Delegation.

The Credentials Committee shall report at such times as directed by the Chair.

Each District Junior President shall poll her delegation and announce the voting strength upon District Roll Call prior to voting. This number cannot be more than that reported by the Credentials Committee.

No one will be permitted to enter or leave the Convention Hall during voting time. Delegates must remain in their District, not leaving the section in which their District is located, except for dire emergency. Delegates will lose their vote if not in the proper voting section when voting by ballot occurs.

Nominations for Honorary Junior Officers shall be made from the floor by her District's Honorary Junior President.

The current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall be the parliamentary authority on all points not covered by these rules.
