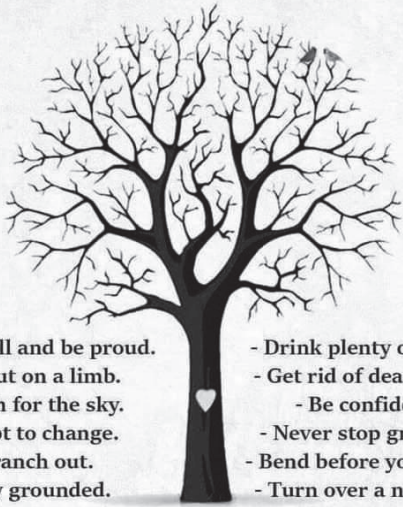

ONE HUNDREDT FIRST ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION • June 30-July 2, 2022

Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza • 35 W. Fifth St. • Cincinnati, Ohio 45020

The One Hundred First Annual Department Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Ohio, is hereby called in conformity with the Department of Ohio Constitution Article V, Section 1, “The Department Convention shall be held annually at the time and place fixed by the American Legion and this Convention shall be the legislative body of the organization”. The convention will be held in **Cincinnati**, Ohio on **June 30-July 2, 2022** with the American Legion Auxiliary Headquarters in the **Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza, 35 W, Fifth St., Cincinnati, Ohio 45020, 800-445-8667**. All Convention meetings, District Caucuses and Convention Sessions will be in the **Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza** with Department **President Colleen Phillips** presiding.

PURPOSE

1. To elect the following officers for the ensuing year in conformity with the Department Constitution Article IV, Section 3, Officers Election, “The President, First Vice President, and Second Vice President shall be elected annually. For those offices with more than one nominee, election shall be by ballot at the Department Convention for a term of one year or until their successors are elected and installed. A plurality vote shall elect. These Officers shall not be eligible for a second term in the same office. These Officers shall assume their duties at the adjournment of the Department Convention”.
 2. To ratify the elections of the District Presidents in the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th , and 13th Districts.
 3. To elect Delegates and Alternates to the National Convention in **Milwaukee, Wisconsin August 26th through September 1st, 2022**.
 4. To ratify the elections of National Delegates and Alternates in all Districts.
- Note: The National Executive Committeeman and any National Officer from the Department of Ohio shall be delegates-at-large to the next succeeding National Convention. All Department Officers, the Delegation Chairman, National Chairmen, all Past National Officers from the Department of Ohio and any National Committee members and/or Central Division National Appointees shall be automatic Delegates to National Convention, to be ratified at the Department Convention. (Department Bylaws, Article VI, Section 2.)
5. To transact other business as may be brought to the attention of the Convention.

Registration will close at the scheduled time on Saturday, July 2, 2022 for the election of Department Officers.

The 2022 Department Convention Delegate Certification Form and the 2022 Department Convention Alternate Certification Form must be returned to Department Headquarters by June 1, 2022 for Del-

egates and Alternates to be certified as Delegates and Alternates to Department Convention.

All Delegates, Alternates, and Visitors must register at the Registration table in order to receive a Convention Packet, credentials card, and official ribbon. Members are required to show their current membership card and sign the registration sheet. Delegates and Alternates are encouraged to take advantage of the pre-pay registration fee of **\$10.00** to be sent to Department Headquarters, PO Box 2760, Zanesville, Ohio 43702 by **June 1, 2022**. The registration fee will be \$15.00 if not received in Department Headquarters by **June 1, 2022**.

The Registration Table will have several stations determined by Districts. Visitors must pay the \$15.00 registration fee. There is no pre-registration for visitors. Visitors are entitled to receive the Convention Packet.

If an Alternate is to become an acting Delegate and the *Alternate To Delegate Certification form* was not sent previously to Department Headquarters by **June 1, 2022**, the Alternate must obtain certification from her Unit President. If she is not available, the Alternate must obtain such authorization from the District President. After meeting these requirements, she may have her status changed at the Registration table and report the change to her District President. (If the Alternate is to replace the official Delegate for one hour or one meeting, she shall report only to her District President).

PRE-PAID REGISTRATION

The Registration Fee is **\$10.00** for all Delegates and Alternates attending the Department Convention whose registration fee is received in Department Headquarters by **June 1, 2021**. Complete the enclosed *Pre-Paid Registration Form* and send to Department Headquarters with payment of \$10.00 per Delegate/Alternate. Make checks payable to Ohio American Legion Auxiliary, PO Box 2760, Zanesville OH 43702. The Registration Fee for Delegates, Alternates and Visitors paying at Convention will be **\$15.00**. Convention fees are non-refundable.

Example: If a Unit is entitled to 3 Delegates and only 1 or 2 plan to attend, only submit the \$10.00 fee for each individual planning to attend. Should the third Delegate decide to attend, she may pay her \$15.00 registration fee at the Department Convention.

CREDENTIAL CARDS AND CONVENTION RIBBONS WILL BE ACQUIRED AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION AT DEPARTMENT CONVENTION.

CONVENTION REPRESENTATION BY UNITS

Any Resolution not properly signed will not receive consideration. (See enclosed Resolutions Rules.)

We received this memo from the Chief of Voluntary Service regarding the return of activities to the VA. We are excited to see this happening and look forward to seeing more openings.

I am pleased to announce that effective immediately group activities except for the CLC can resume at the Cincinnati VA/FTD with the following caveats:

- Volunteers/visitors coming onsite must be fully vaccinated and documented with our office -COVID and flu

- Events/activities cannot exceed fifty total attendees

Children and Youth

It is April and even though our reporting year has come to an end, it does not mean that the needs of our military families and homeless children no longer need our help. The need to make their lives a little easier will always be there year-round.

The department has received several Youth Hero and Good Deed awards. Van Wert Unit 178 honored Hunter Tinsley and Braxton Kouts with Youth Hero Award for their quick actions after of discovering fire in the attic of their home. They immediately awaken the other members of the household and knocked on the door of their adjoining duplex to awaking the neighbor to get her to safety. Winnow-Arn Unit 541 from Continental awarded six-year-old Barrett Rau with the Youth Hero Award after he walk a mile and half in the dark and cold to get help for his mother who was having a medical emergency. Unit 541, also submitted for the Youth Hero Award Damien Dotson who rescued a neighbor after a four-wheeler accident. When Damien's neighbor drove into a pond and could not swim, 15-year-old Damien jumped into the pond and got the man to the shore of the pond. He immediately started chest compressions. Once the man had come to, Damien ran to his mom's house to call 911. Derrick Milbach, a third grader, was awarded the Youth Hero award by Levi Phillips Unit 85 in Newark. Derrick is credited for saving the life of a classmate from chocking on a hamburger during lunch by using the Heimlich maneuver.

Unit 541 awarded the Good Deed awards to Reese and Parker Knowles. The two young men assisted their grandfather with a cemetery project. The grandfather's Post places flags on the graves for Memorial Day in nine cemeteries. Many of the flag holders were just stuck in the ground so when it rained, the wind would blow them down. Their grandfather, a Viet Nam veteran, came up with the idea to bury coffee

cans filled with concrete and a PVC pipe just large enough for the flag holder. Parker and Reese help their grandfather with both filling the coffee cans and the burying the cans for fifty or more grave marker/flag holders.

There is no deadline for either of these awards. They can be submitted and awarded anytime. Don't forget the young people who are taking on caregiver duties. They can be awarded certificates found on the alaforveterans.org website. All young people deserved to be recognized for their efforts in volunteering to help others. These deeds help them to have a better understanding of community service and giving to others.

Heads up! The Department will be part of the National project called "Stuff the Bag." The National has supplied the Department with ALA branded sling backpacks, ALA coloring books, and crayons. The funding is coming from a grant from the Child Welfare Fund to help put the American Legion Family out in front of the youth throughout the country and to instill the American Legion Family values represented in the coloring books. The coloring books are the two coloring books that could be downloaded from the website. One explains the importance of the poppy and the other giving safety tips for Halloween.

For the Department of Ohio to have success with this project, we need your help. We will be stuffing the bags at School of Instruction. We are asking for units to collect comfort items such as stickers, small push toys, Legos, flags, patriotic dog tags, pins, bracelets, poppies, poppy seeds, hard candies and school supplies. These items can be brought to School of Instruction where the bags will be stuffed in between programs.

Constitution and Bylaws

All organizations are organized and conduct business and mission service according to the organization's governing documents. In ALA, the vital governing documents are its Articles of Incorporation – its Constitution; its Bylaws – its fundamental structure and fundamental rules; and its Standing Rules – its process and detailed rules that "stand" for all to follow yet can be amended as frequently needed to keep the unit functioning well.

Units determine how their Constitution and Bylaws will be written and adopted, including key provisions of its governance structure, including offices, the number of officers, terms, the composition of the governing board, the minimum required meetings per year, who can call meetings, and how, what constitutes a quorum, roles, and responsibilities, etc. However, nothing in the Unit's Constitution and Bylaws can conflict with or oppose anything in the ALA Department and National Constitution and Bylaws. Remember Constitution and Bylaws should align with the national organization's mission and general overall structure and function.

The Department of Ohio ALA does not approve or disapprove Unit Constitution and Bylaws. The Department Constitution and Bylaws chairman (if asked) only reviews to assist the unit with structure. Once the chairman reviews your documents, she will send you a notice of acceptance, meaning your documents meet the required format.

The approval of a Unit's Constitution and Bylaws is by the vote of the unit's mem-

bers. Therefore, all Unit members should receive a signed copy of the Constitution and Bylaws and standing rules.

Remember: every unit is required to have Constitution and Bylaws and standing rules. However, it is not mandatory for your documents to be on file at Department Headquarters; that is your unit's choice.

The Department asked units to provide a copy for file at headquarters because when a question comes up or a member contacts the Department with a complaint, it is easier to review the C&B and standing rules to resolve the problem promptly.

Complying with your governing documents (Constitution and Bylaws and Standing Rules) is critical. Any decision that does not follow the provisions outlined in the Constitution and Bylaws is unconstitutional and therefore invalid. Decisions made by the unit that do not follow its Constitution and Bylaws could be ruled invalid if challenged in a court of law. A unit's decisions and actions contrary to the Constitution and Bylaws can have serious consequences. A pattern of decisions and acts contrary to a unit's Constitution and Bylaws or severe violations of its Constitution and Bylaws can be grounds for a lawsuit and/or suspension or revocation of the unit's charter.

We still have Department and National Convention to work through, but you cannot wait to the last minute to start preparing for the next year. Units should start now! There's a new Auxiliary year dawning...new officers, new chairmen, new members, new ideas and new energy. Have you done any planning to assist as a member or unit as a whole to succeed! Yes, I said as a member and a unit because you need to be working as a team...change the "me" to "we". Change the "my" unit to "our" unit. Also remember we are the American Legion Auxiliary and belong to a Unit...we are not a lady's auxiliary especially with the "new" eligibility criteria and we are not a post. Let me give you a few items to put in your Leadership Tool Box to aid you in achieving success.

1. Organize and read your National, Department, District and Unit Documents... Constitution, Bylaws, Standing Rules, Policy and Procedures and the Program Action Plans (National level calls "Key Program Statements"). Provide copies to all members and encourage them to read them. (Spoiler ALERT these describe your duties as an officer, chairman and member)

2. Have you prepared a budget and discussed finances? This should be done prior to your first official meeting so it can be voted on for approval. Has your unit paid the bonding fee and filled out the appropriate IRS form.

3. As Unit President and Secretary SHARE the Departments' Bulk Mail and items you find in the Buckeye Messenger. (Spoiler ALERT...this article would be a good share)

4. Plan rejuvenate membership by touching base with your members that have not attended meetings in a while for whatever reason or even not paid their dues. Let them know they are still important and you value their knowledge and volunteerism.

5. Share with your members your activities. Use a newsletter, face book, email

blasts or a Unit website. Don't target solely the members that attend meetings, but ALL members! The younger generation and even our seasoned members are using the social media for finding out information. If you don't have this, you are missing out on possible new members, new volunteers and more participation in your activities.

6. Have you taken the (1) American Legion Auxiliary Senior Auxiliary Basics, A Course on our History and Legacy; The ALA Academy courses; Mission Training Courses; (National -www.alaforveterans.org); (2) A Journey On Becoming A Success & Knowledgeable Member and other training slide shows about the Unit, District and more (Ohio-www.alaohio.org)

7. Plan and encourage your members to attend District, Department and National meetings. Provide an idea on what they will learn as part of that encouragement.

8. I saved the BEST FOR LAST...the ALA UNIT GUIDE BOOK, Revised 2021. Many of the questions I received as Leadership Chairman can be found in this book. Let's take a quick walk through it: Rules on Governing Use of Emblem; Eligibility; Types of Membership; Holding Membership Dues; Recommended Unit Operations; Privacy of Unit Members; Non-Profit Information, Compliance, and Practices (this involves tax laws; TIN/EIN; Tax-Exempt 7 more); Duties of Unit Officers; Unit Meeting; Protocol; Committees; ALA Foundation; Sample Unit C&B; Fundamentals of Parliamentary Procedure; How to Write a Resolution; Conducting Electronic Meetings; Honorary Juniors; ALA Academy

9. Still need help as a unit...contact a Past Unit President, a Past District President, the current District President or the Leadership Chairman.

There are many tools out there to help YOUR unit succeed. You just need to take that "first step" to research, share and ask questions.

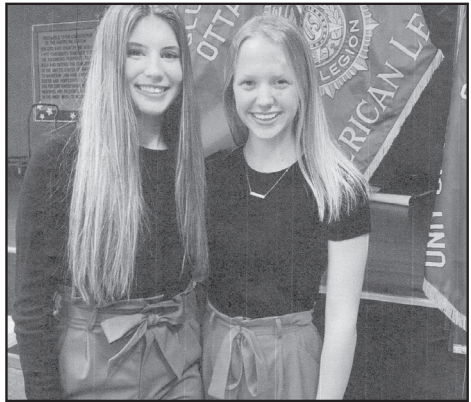

On St. Patrick’s Day Unit 112 served corned beef sandwiches at the post. Looks like the girls are having fun.

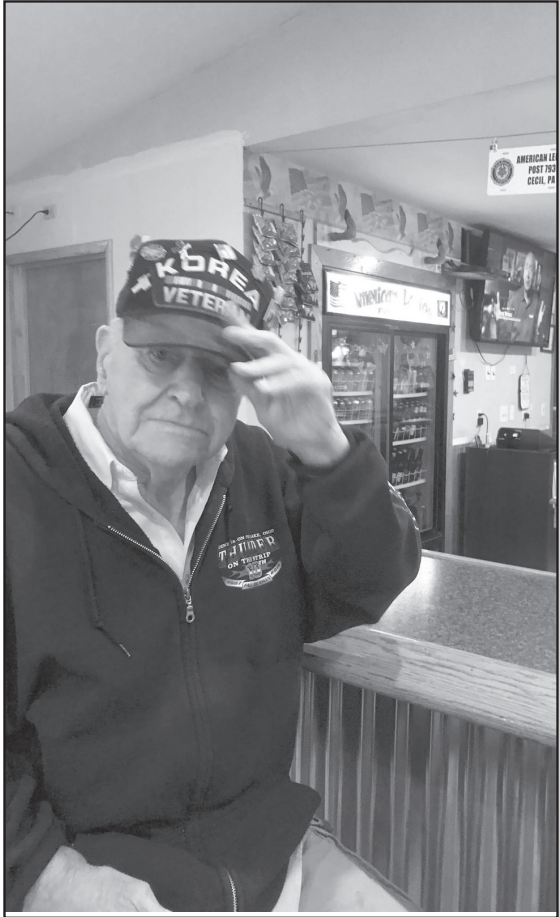

Spring is really here finally and that must mean time for reports to be in mailed to Chairmen. Hope you bragged about the accomplishments of your members and your Unit.

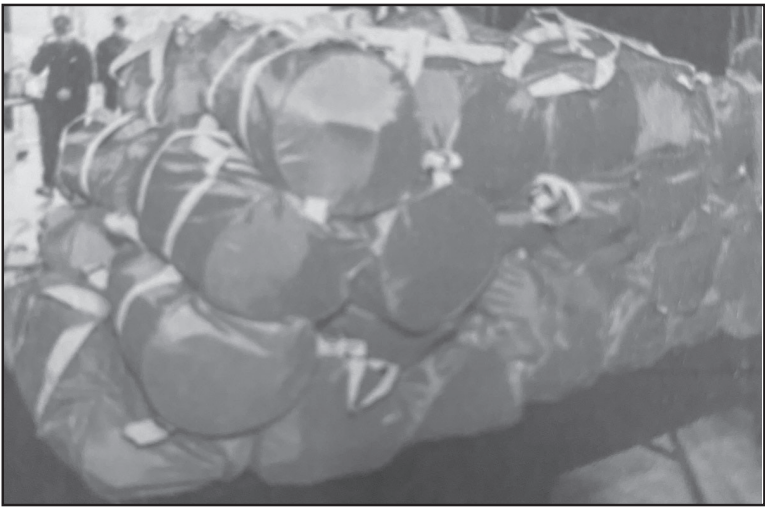

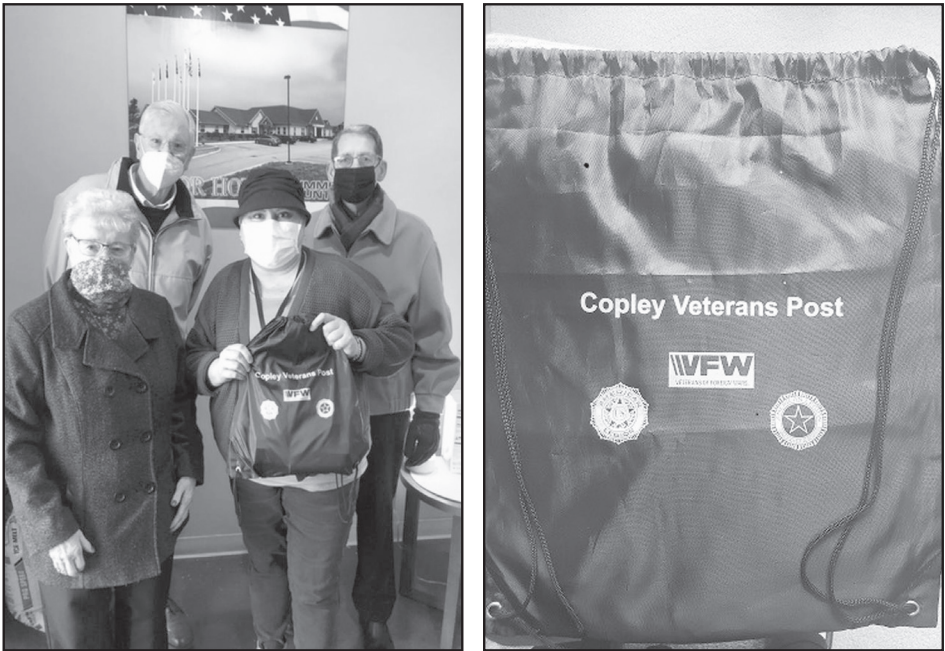
